Linda Christensen is the Director of the Oregon Writing Project (OWP) in the Graduate School of Education at Lewis & Clark College. She is also the author of *Reading, Writing, and Rising Up: Teaching about Social Justice, Teaching for Joy and Justice: Re-Imagining the Language Arts Classroom, Rhythm and Resistance: Teaching Poetry for Social Justice.* She has also co-edited several books, including *Rethinking Elementary* Education; *Rethinking School Reform: Views from the Classroom; Reading, Writing, and Rising Up.* She is also a member of the editorial board of the distinguished activist journal for social justice in schools, *Rethinking Schools.* Linda has taught high school Language Arts for forty years in Portland, Oregon, where for some years she also served as a Language Arts Curriculum Specialist. She has received numerous national and regional awards, including the Fred Hechinger Award for the use of research in teaching and writing, the Outstanding Teacher in the Western United States, and the Humanitarian Award from Willamette Writers. She a is a popular keynote speaker for local, national, and international conferences, where she regularly inspires teachers and administrators with her commitment to and success in teaching literacy as a consequence and instrument of social justice. Her workshops for teachers over the past two decades (in combination with her writing) have made her a nationally influential agent of transformational change among secondary teachers of English.
