Faculty & Student Survey Results: Highlights

- Quantitative Results posted on website
- Qualitative Results under coding review; results will be posted
- Are doing many things well; some revisions would help: mission, value, relevancy, consistency

Four Open Sessions with Faculty: Highlights

- Public Affairs mission as a "brand": infuse the 42-hour-block, or require additional upperdivision courses? offer certificate?
- Number of hours: allow courses to "double count" for major rather than requiring more hours
- Languages: require but incorporate into major or minor or integrate into other skills rather than as separate requirement
- "Cultural competency": define--cultures within US, past and present, as well as global cultures?
- **Integration** of skills for 21st century & explicit interconnections among the learning needed; teaching transferable and applicable skills rather than discipline-specific content
- Concern with "turf": need equitable distribution of courses among colleges
- **Need for best instructors** in general education
- Need for students to care and not to see gen ed as something to "get out of the way"
- Need to raise standards for students

Student Focus Groups: Highlights

- Course content: Change some specific courses (PED; CIS)
- Course content: too easy & redundant with high school; more waivers
- Class size too large: more honors-type, smaller classes for all students
- One science course is enough for non-science majors
- More flexibility to take courses in major field
- Language requirement or emphasis
