There was discussion that the guiding principles could be divided by principles for programs and principles for courses. A sub-committee will sort out the Guiding Principles as to what would be relevant to the entire program and what might be relevant to specific courses.

The committee was asked to review the other handouts on AACU Essential Learning Outcomes and the Miami-Dade learning outcomes before the next meeting.
