APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES

• The Minutes were approved by unanimous consent.

EXECUTIVE REPORTS

- Chair Report
 - Chair Hains gave an update on the Executive Board Meeting with the President. Retention payment is a go; all full-time employees hired by April 1, 2022, will receive a one-time retention payment in their December paycheck. Full-time employees will also receive a 4% raise, and the minimum wage will go to \$15/hr. starting July 1, 2022.
 - Additional announcements:
 - Zora Mulligan was selected as Executive Vice President, and Dr. John Jasinski was selected as the Interim Provost. Both will start July 1, 2022.
 - Bear Line schedule will be changing for the Fall 2022 semester.
 - No update on Commerce Bank replacement.
 - All Covid policies expire on June 30th.
 - Updated Bylaws were emailed out Senators.
 - Chair Hains announced that four Senators are leaving. They have been mailed or were presented their certificates in meeting.
- Chair-Elect Report
 - Chair-Elect Wells gave a budget update. The only thing pending is some catering receipts.
 - Chair-Elect Wells gave an update on day of caring on June 23rd.
- Past Chair Report
 - Past Chair Reed absent report given by Chair Hains. Update on Jason Rhea Memorial could include other covid tributes to lost employees of Covid.

- Secretary Report
 - Secretary Hader gave an update on JF 4 and election outcomes

EXTERNAL REPRESENTATION REPORTS

- Board of Governor's Chair-Hains May meeting went well.
 - The Wyrick Commission is moving forward with the Three Pillars monument that will be placed in the North Mall.
 - Additional Cloud Storage will be given to all employees.
 - New updates to Advisor Success Coaches technology.
 - New web layout for My.MissouriState.edu coming soon.
- Faculty Senate: Senator Schindler at SOAR, Chair Hains gave reports.
 - The policy committee of Faculty Senate is working with Student Government Association about having a more ubiquitous use of Blackboard. Minimum requirements being defined for Faculty.
- Health Care and Benefits: Chair Hains met on Wednesday.
 - Emergency Paid Covid Leave extends through June 30th
 - The new dental plan is really seeing good use.
 - The EAP (Employee Assistance Program) is being used more, and HR is advertising this benefit more robustly. HR rep referenced that Part Time employees are also able to use the EAP through Mercy.
 - 228 employees have used emergency paid leave since January.
 - HR is working to ensure Benefits are displayed correctly on pay stubs.
 - June 22nd employee wellness, yoga, and racquet ball soon, and has rolled out a digital newsletter.
- IT council: Senator Hader Canceled June meeting will meet in July with new representatives, work on computer lab replacement cycle.
- Shared leave: Chair-Elect Wells has not had any cases since last meeting.
- Sustainability Commission: Chair Wells talked about the Garden and Shed, encouraging people to visit it.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

- The Council for Administrative Professional Forum: end of year, have started working on fall. Working towards timeline less so on what, encouraged submitting topics. Working towards October meeting. Gave thank you plaques to the committee, and Chair Hains for her assistance over the last year.
- Public Affairs: Senator Rigby talked about the street clean-up, which was canceled for May due to lack of interest. Looking at July 8th from 11 to 1:30 for the next one. Also looking at book club for September 19th, with public affairs speaker Marlee Matlin.
