QUESTIONS TO HELP "NEW MEMBER" ACADEMICS

- 1. How are your classes going? Are you having any problems? What seems to be your most challenging class this semester?
- 2. How are you getting along with your instructors? Do you know anyone else in your class? Have you talked with the instructor during office hours?
- 3. Do you have problems with note-taking? Do your test results reflect the amount of time you studied?
- 4. How do you prepare for tests for this particular class?
- 5. Are you working on or off-campus? How many hours per week do you work?
- 6. Is the fraternity taking up too much of your out-of-class time?
- 7. How much studying do you do outside of fraternity study hall?

Suggestions:

- a. The first person to talk to when you are experiencing problems with a class is the instructor.
- b. Attending class every day can be worth a whole letter grade.
- c. Talk with your academic advisor when the problem first develops.
- d. Working 20 hours per week is the maximum for a student who is full-time.
