Submission guidelines

- Write a three-page essay on your opinion about the ethics of transferring genes from one species to another (plants, animals, viruses, etc.) to create genetically modified organisms (GMOs). You must use a minimum of 3 professional references, but preferably more.
- Include the references used on a separate page following current APA or MLA style guides.
- The submitted work is to be double spaced, Times New Roman 12 pt. font, and 750-1,000 words in length.
- The cover page is to include the title and date of submission, author's name, phone number and email address.
- Essays are to be submitted on-line to Logos@MissouriState.edu. Send essay questions there.
- Submissions will be subject to a blind review by the LOGOS Editorial board.
- The *Ethical Dilemmas in Trans-Species DNA Transfer* panelists will review the top papers to determine winners.
- One monetary award will go to the top faculty/staff paper. The winning paper in this (faculty/staff) category will be posted on the *eJournal of Public Affairs* website, with the opportunity for a peer-reviewed publication. - The second monetary award will go to the top student paper. The winning submission in this category will be published in LOGOS, a journal of undergraduate research.
- The top papers will be read by their respective authors at the beginning of the Oct. 4th Academic Integrity evening session at 6:00 p.m. in the Plaster Student Union Theater.
- AIC members, session panelists, LOGOS, and *e-Journal* staff are not eligible to compete.

One submission per person will be accepted with Turnitin checks for originality.

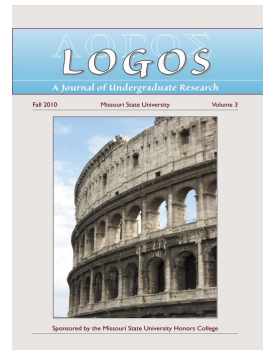
