## General Guidelines

All participants must be an active brother, sister, or new member in an active fraternity or sorority at Missouri State University. Participants must be listed on the chapter roster to participate in any event. Participants must be currently in Good Academic Standing at the university.

Participation points will be determined based on the percentage of active members in attendance, included on each chapter's roster, present at the requested sign-in times. Members who are in class during an event will be excused from participation numbers. If it is determined that a team's sign-in sheet has been falsified, that team will be disqualified from said event.

The chosen judges for all events will be the primary judges. ALL JUDGES DECISIONS ARE FINAL. If you have questions about a rule or need further interpretation of a rule, please ask and contact one of the Greek Week chairs. If there are questions regarding a rule, only 1 representative from each team may approach the Greek Week chair(s).

**There will be no drugs or alcohol at any Greek Week event.** Anyone suspected of being under the influence will be asked to leave. Their attendance will not be counted.

**All events begin promptly at their scheduled time. It is advised that participants appear at the designated check-in time.** Failure for a team to show up for a scheduled event will result in a loss of all possible points possible for that event. Check-ins will be accepted up until five (5) minutes before the scheduled start time. If a participant fails to appear, he or she will be disqualified.

Cancellation or postponement of an event due to weather or other circumstances is at the discretion of the Greek Week Committee. Notice of such cancellations or postponements will be made directly to each chapter Greek Week Chair and via the Greek Week 2012 Facebook and Twitter accounts. If no notice is given, each team is to assume the event will still occur.

Any inappropriate behavior against the Fraternity and Sorority Life spirit at MSU, as viewed by the Greek Week Committee may result in loss of points, disqualification from the named event, or removal from participation in Greek Week.

## **Greek Week Alcohol and Substance Policy**

All fraternity and sorority members participating in Greek Week 2012 shall understand that all activities relating to Greek Week are not to involve the possession or consumption of alcohol or illegal substances. The Greek Week Committee, IFC, PHA, and NPHC will have a ZERO TOLERANCE POLICY for all events concerning Greek Week for any fraternity or sorority member, regardless of age.

***Violation of this policy will result in disqualification of the entire team of the event in question, or may result in disqualification of the entire team from all Greek Week events.***

A Greek Week team/pairing will be subject to disqualification if:

- Alcohol is consumed by any member of the FSL community at any Greek Week event, beginning on Sunday March 4<sup>th</sup>, 2012 and will come to a close on Sunday March 11<sup>th</sup>, 2012.
- Any member is in possession of alcohol or other illegal substances at any Greek Week event.
- Any member is observed or cited by law enforcement officials for any alcohol or illegal controlled substance violation at any Greek Week event.
- Any member attends a Greek Week event under the influence of alcohol and/or illegal substances.

All members of the approved chapter roster are to be held responsible for the above chapter policies.

In the event that a member/members of a Greek Week team is/are cited for a violation of the alcohol and substance policy as stated above, the team's chapter presidents and chapter advisors will be notified.

## Grievance Form

Grievances shall be typed and delivered to the Fraternity & Sorority Life Office (PSU 116) during regular business hours, **within 24 hours of the incident**. Grievances must meet the following two conditions:

1. Cite the basis of the grievance
2. Provide sufficient and detailed information to support the grievance

Grievances must be based on one or more of the following:

1. Violation of the Greek Week rules, policies, and procedures
2. Assumed bias by officials/judges in competitive events

Grievances will be heard by the Greek Week Co-Chairs and advisor and decisions will be rendered within 48 hours after the grievance was filed. Decisions may be appealed to the IFC, PHA, NPHC presidents and council advisors.

### **Rules & Regulations**

1. A random drawing will choose order of performance by **Thursday March 1st**. Seating will be determined in reverse order of performance. Pairings will sit together and enough space will be provided for chapter members in the pairing.
2. A maximum of fifty (50) members per pairing will be allowed to participate in Greek Jam. All chapters in the pairing must have the opportunity to participate; if this becomes an issue contact the Greek Jam co-chairs and they will handle the situation. Each chapter in a pairing is permitted equal representation. If at any time a chapter feels uncomfortable with how the spots are filed in their pairing, contact a Greek Jam co-chair.
3. All dancers are required to buy tickets for Greek Jam
4. Alcohol, drugs, and any illegal substances are NOT permitted under any circumstances at the dress rehearsal or the performance. Dancers will check in individually with a member of the Greek Week Committee and any dancer found to be intoxicated will be asked to leave and not be permitted to perform. Further consequences may be given at the discretion of the Greek Jam co-chairs, Greek Week co-chairs, and Greek Week advisor.
5. No outside assistance may be used when choreographing dances. Only ACTIVE chapter members may be involved in choreographing the dances. No previous dances may be used. If a pairing is found to have used outside assistance in choreographing their routine the pairing will be disqualified.
6. Three copies of your CD are required to the Office of Student Engagement by **Friday, March 2, 2012 at 4:00pm**. Your CD needs to be labeled with: all the chapters in the pairing, your theme, performance number, and emergency contact number.
7. **The Greek Jam rehearsal is MANDATORY and will take place on Friday, March 9, 2012 or Saturday March 10, 2012.** A rehearsal schedule will be provided a minimum of two weeks before the rehearsal; however, the order will follow that of the actual performance. Any conflicts should be addressed in writing with the Greek Jam co-chairs. Each pairing will receive forty-five (45) minutes for their rehearsal; if you exceed this time you will be deducted points.
8. No practicing may be done in the performance space prior to the dress rehearsal.

9. **Greek Jam practices may begin on January 17<sup>th</sup> and pairings should not practice more than 10 hours per week. Beginning March 3, 2012 pairings may practice as many hours per week as they choose.**
10. No one except the dancers and the Greek Week Committee members will be allowed in the building more than thirty (30) minutes prior to the start of the event on the day of event.
11. Each pairing will have eight minutes maximum for their performance. An additional four (4) minutes will be given for combined set up and take down. For example: a pairing may take three (3) minutes to set up, but only one minute will remain to take everything down. Each pairing will be timed by Greek Week Committee members, but is welcome to have their own timer as well; however, the official time will be that of the Greek Week Committee.
12. Your time starts as soon as you enter the performance space and ends when all people, props, and costumes are off of the performance space.
13. Only members of the chapters in the pairing may be on the floor during the routine. In addition to the maximum of fifty (50) dancers, each pairing may have a maximum of five (5) non-dancing members to help with the set up and take down of props, costumes, etc. These members need to be in visible chapter letters.
14. In terms of stunts, no basket tosses or holding someone at full extension above someone's head will be permitted. The committee **requires** the use of spotters to promote safety for all dancers. The week before Greek Jam, the Greek Jam co-chairs and the advisor will see only the dance moves that may be questionable. If a move is found to be too dangerous, the pairing will be asked to change it by the Greek Jam rehearsal.
15. All dancers and participants must wear proper shoes or bare feet to during all performances and rehearsals.
16. During the performance, if your music skips, stops, or has any other problems, your pairing will be given the opportunity to start the performance over from the beginning; however, you may choose to start from a different point if you wish. This is limited to two retries.
17. Please see the score sheet for judging categories.
18. Do not leave trash in the stands (dancers or audience members). Please clear the dance space of any trash, props, costumes, glitter, etc. before leaving the space. Anything left after the performance will result in point deduction.
19. Disrespect towards other chapters/pairings will NOT be tolerated. This includes any verbal comments, booing at the events, poor sportsmanship, misconduct via social networking, etc. This will result in serious point deduction.
20. If a chapter or pairing receives a point deduction, the team captain(s) will be informed through written notification and through e-mail.

## Greek God and Goddess

### Requirements & Eligibility

1. Contestants must have a cumulative GPA of at least 2.5 during the semester of Greek Week 2012 and be in good standing with their affiliated chapter
2. Contestants must pay a \$20 entry fee made out to the Greek Week Committee
3. Contestants must attend both informational meetings on **Thursday, February 9<sup>th</sup>, 2012** and **Thursday, February 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2012**. Both meetings will begin at 8:00 PM. The first meeting will be held in **PSU 308 ABC** and the second will be held in **PSU 315 ABC**. Information about the contest and Greek Week will be provided at this time. If you cannot attend, a representative can be sent in your place with the approval of the Greek God/Goddess Chair(s). Failure to be represented at this meeting will result in a 10 point deduction of points.
4. Each contestant must be available for: (class is an exception; however a class schedule must be provided to a Greek God/Goddess Chair).
  - Greek Olympics
  - God and Goddess Pageant
  - Service/Philanthropy
  - Greek Jam
5. Contestants will decorate a sash with their chapter name and wear it during all Greek Week events
6. Contestants agree to maintain a pro-FSL attitude and represent their chapter and the entire FSL community in a tasteful and honorable manner.
7. **All candidates are expected to attend all scheduled classes during Greek Week and are not permitted to skip class for any activity.** Class schedules will be turned in with Greek God/Goddess Application. Arrangements will be made if activities and class conflict. **If a candidate is caught skipping class, he or she will be disqualified from the competition.**
8. Failure to follow the above requirements will result in a loss of points determined by the Greek God and Goddess Chairs.
9. Greek God and Goddess participants and individual chapter Greek Week Chairs are required to attend all meetings. Chapter Greek Week Chairs are not required at rehearsals.

## Health and Safety Regulations

1. All participants must keep their hair restrained – hair nets, ball caps, or ponytails. NO HAIR MAY BE OUT OF RESTRAINTS!
2. All food must be fully cooked and kept at a temperature that meets city health codes (165 degrees Fahrenheit). Food stored at the booth must be kept in iced coolers at a temperature of 41 degrees Fahrenheit or less.
3. Anyone handling food must wear plastic gloves while serving. Gloves need to be changed after every activity.
4. Each booth must have a bottle of hand sanitizer to use when necessary.
5. All areas of the dessert must remain covered when not serving.
6. When preparing your dessert, wash your hands thoroughly with warm water and soap for at least 20 seconds before and after handling raw meat and poultry.
7. Prevent cross-contamination:
  - a. Use only clean, sanitized food containers, cutting boards, and utensils.
  - b. Use separate utensils for raw food and ready-to-eat food.
  - c. Don't touch ready-to-eat foods with bare hands – use utensils or disposable gloves

**\*\*Failure to follow the rules above will result in disqualification\*\***

**FOR A SAFE COOKOUT  
Food Handling Guidelines**

Safe and careful handling of raw meat and poultry is **critical** to prevent harmful bacteria from multiplying and contaminating other foods. It is extremely important that proper temperatures are reached during cooking to destroy harmful bacteria. Here's what you should do to make sure the food you cook and serve at your cookout is both delicious **and safe**.

**WASH HANDS THOROUGHLY**

- Wash hands with warm water and soap for at least 20 seconds **before and after handling raw meat and poultry**.

**PREVENT CROSS-CONTAMINATION**

- Use only **clean, sanitized** food containers, cutting boards and utensils.
- **Don't** use the same utensils or food containers for handling raw meat and poultry and also for handling ready-to-eat foods, (i.e., hamburger buns, cooked foods.)
- Use **separate** cutting boards for raw foods and ready-to-eat foods.
- **Don't** touch raw foods and **then** ready-to-eat foods with **the same utensil**.
- **Don't** touch ready-to-eat foods with bare hands. Use utensils or disposable gloves.

**COOK FOODS THOROUGHLY**

- Keep burgers and chicken (and all other perishable foods) on ice until ready to cook.
- Cook **burgers to 155°F/68°C**. To check the temperature, insert the thermometer probe for 15 seconds in the center of the burger, at a 45° angle.
- Cook **poultry to 165°F/74°C**. Place thermometer in the thickest part of the meat (for 15 seconds).
- Keep cooked burgers and chicken hot, at a minimum temperature of **140°F/60°C** or above. Eat within 2 hour time period.

Your foodservice department will provide you with food that has been prepared and stored safely according to our HACCP (Hazard Analysis Critical Control Point) procedures. We will make sure that you have an adequate supply of clean, sanitized food containers and utensils. If requested, we will provide a thermometer for checking the internal temperature of meat and poultry during cooking and disposable gloves for handling ready-to-eat foods.

#### 1. DRESS CODE

- a. The Greek Week Pageant Chairs must approve all costumes and clothing prior to the event.
  - i. No nudity
  - ii. No costumes with inappropriate, suggestive or explicit content as deemed so by the Greek Week Committee or judges.

#### 2. TALENT ETIQUETTE AND BEHAVIOR

- a. The talent to be performed by contestants must be approved by the Greek Week Pageant Show Chairs prior to the event. **If the approved talent is changed when the contestant goes on stage, the contestant will be disqualified from the competition.**
- b. The contestant performing the talent is allowed to have no more than five (5) people assisting them (i.e. backup dancers/singers, etc.)
- c. The talent may be a maximum of three (3) minutes long. Anyone going over the time limit will receive a five (5) point deduction.
- d. NO profanity or other inappropriate language as deemed so by the Greek Week Committee or judges (i.e., rude jokes, references, etc).
- e. **ALL CONTESTANTS MUST BE SOBER** in order to participate in the competition. If contestants are intoxicated, they **WILL BE REMOVED** and **DISQUALIFIED** from the event.

#### 3. AUDIENCE ETIQUETTE AND BEHAVIOR

- a. Please inform fellow chapter members in attendance at the event that if their actions are out of line, they will be removed from the audience. The associated contestant will receive a thirty (30) point deduction.
- b. All audience members must be sober.

**Any actions violating Articles 1 or 2 will result in expulsion from competition and automatic disqualification – THE PERFORMER(S) WILL BE REMOVED FROM THE STAGE IMMEDIATELY! Any actions brought against Article 3 will result in a thirty (30) point deduction from overall Greek Week points.**
