**Integrated Service-Learning Course (ISL)** - A stand-alone service-learning course that has all of the components of experiential education, reflection, and assessment ingrained into the substance of the course. The community service experiences of the students are not just a sidebar, but also an integral component of the course. **ISL** is conceptualized as a pedagogical model that connects meaningful community service experiences with academic course learning. When community service is integrated into an academic course, the course credit is assigned for both the customary academic learning as well as for the utilization of community learning in the service of the course learning. The student's grade is for the *quality of learning* as identified through reflection mechanisms set forth by the course instructor and not for the quantity of service.
