Prospective volunteers will be screened to determine their appropriateness for the role of a facilitator/mediator. This screening includes a comprehensive background check, which may include but is not limited to a criminal history check and a child abuse/neglect history check.

By signing below you authorize the Greene County Juvenile Division, the Greene County Prosecutor's Office, and/or The Center for Dispute Resolution to conduct a comprehensive background check, and you release the Greene County Juvenile Division, Greene County Prosecutor's Office, the Center for Dispute Resolution, and any other agencies involved from any liability that may result.
