GPA Requirements Include: Combined GPA of 2.5 or higher before enrollment in PED 200 and Admission into Teacher Education; at least a 2.50 GPA on all courses attempted at all colleges attended; at least a 2.50 GPA in the certificate subject area (major field of study); at least a 2.50 GPA in any additional certificate subject area; at least a 2.50 GPA in the professional educational courses; and no grade lower than a "C" in all professional education courses.

Other Requirements include: Completion of PED 200, PED 431, PED 440, PED 411, PED468, PED 575, RDG 474, PSY 360, PED 493, and PED 496 with a C or better.

Completion of COM 115 with a C or better; Completion of all portions of CBASE with a score of 265 or higher before Admission into Teacher Education
