

ENGLISH PLACEMENT GUIDELINES

ACT

- Students **with** an English score of 18 and below are placed in ENG 100
- Students **with** an English score of 19 **and** above are placed in ENG 110.
- No placement test is required, and there is no appeal to this placement.

SAT

- Students with an English score of 450 **and** below are placed in ENG 100.
- Students with an English score of 451 and above are placed in ENG 110.
- No placement test is required, and there is no appeal to this placement.

CLEP

- Students with a 50 **and** above on the English Composition with Essay **exam** receive credit for ENG 110 and ENG 210.

CONTINUING EDUCATION

- Continuing Education will administer the placement test, and the English Department will evaluate it for Continuing Ed students who have not **taken** the ACT.

INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

The English Department will administer and evaluate the placement test for international students who have not **taken** the ACT

- Students who have taken **the** TOEFL test may **use** the **W E** score from the paper TOEFL or Essay rating from the computer-based TOEFL:
 - Students with a 1, 2, or 3 are **placed** in ENG 100 (section for non-native speakers — sections numbered 490.491 , etc.).
 - Students with 4, 5, or 6 **are** placed in ENG 110 (section for non-native speakers).
- Dr. Tina Biava (Pummill 209D, 836-5967) will determine placement for **students** who have completed work with the English Language Institute.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT

- Students with a 3 or 4 on the English Language and Composition or the English Literature and Composition test receive credit for ENG 110.
- Students with a 5 on the English Language and Composition or the English Literature and Composition test receive credit for ENG 110 and ENG 210.

INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE

- Students with a 4-6 on the Standard-Level English **exam** receive credit for ENG 287.
- Students with a 7 on the Standard-Level English **exam** receive credit for ENG 210 and ENG 287.
- Students with a 4 or 5 on the Higher-Level English exam receive credit for ENG 287.
- Students with a 6 on the Higher-Level English exam receive credit for ENG 210 and ENG 207.
- Students with a score of 7 on the Higher-Level English exam receive credit for ENG 210, ENG 230, and ENG 287.

TRANSFER CREDIT

Students with one composition course receive credit for ENG 110.

Students with two composition courses receive credit for ENG 110 and GEP 5,
