Note: "Military-Affiliated" combines veteran and dependent students. A student is considered a veteran if he or she indicates active military, National Guard, Reserves, or veteran status on the admission application, Federal Application for Student Aid (FAFSA), or Veteran Certification Request for Veteran Affairs (VA) benefits. MSU began tracking veteran status mid-academic period Spring 2012. Thus, historical data prior to Spring 2012 may not exist. A student is considered a dependent when the student received benefits under Chapter 33 and Chapter 35. Benefits are obtained from the VA and pay for specific costs of higher education.

*Note: Other Programs includes non-degree-seeking undergraduates, precollege dual credit students, undeclared students, BA Global Studies majors, BGS General Studies majors, pre-professional students, and pre-Individualized Majors.
