## Conference Keynote Speakers

**Congressman Richard Gephardt** has been serving his community, state, and country for over thirty years. In 1977, he was elected to the U.S. House of Representatives, and served as House Majority Leader from 1989-1995. He became House Minority Leader in 1995, where he continued to serve until his retirement in 2004. A year later, he founded the Gephardt Institute for Public Service, and continues to provide ongoing support for its vision for the future.

**Jeffrey Howard**, University of Michigan, is the founder and editor of the Michigan Journal of Community Service-Learning. He also serves as the Associate Director for Service-Learning at the University of Michigan's Edward Ginsberg Center for Community Service and Learning. Jeffrey Howard has written and co-authored on a number of books and articles, including the *Service-Learning Course Design Workbook*, and *Academic Service-Learning: A Pedagogy of Action and Reflection*.
