

7. Community Resources

7.1 Child welfare worker identifies the types of formal and informal neighborhood resources and develops strategies that assist families' access to these supportive resources.

7.2 Child welfare worker engages professionals and agencies to collaborate and develop naturally occurring resources.

7.2 Child welfare worker advocates for integrated services for families who are served by multiple community providers.

New: I advocate for integrated services for families who are served by multiple community providers.

7.3 Child welfare worker demonstrates awareness of the intra- and inter-agency barriers in the environment, culture, and community that prevent access by families to needed services and resources.

New: I have a working knowledge of the various barriers that prevent access by families to needed services and resources.

7.4 Child welfare worker demonstrates knowledge of proper roles and responsibilities of other disciplines and community agencies, and collaborates with the multi-disciplinary teams to develop case plans and provide services for their clients, which utilize the clients' strengths.

New: I know the proper roles and responsibilities of other disciplines and community agencies and collaborate with multi-disciplinary teams to develop case plans and provide services.

7.6 Child welfare worker facilitates the development of an inter-agency, interdisciplinary, team approach in providing services for families served by the child welfare agency.

New: I work to develop an inter-agency, interdisciplinary, team approach to provide services for families served by the child welfare agency.
