While all students interested in German can take the courses listed above, there are three different degrees from which German majors can choose: Bachelor of Science in Education (BS in Ed), Bachelor of Arts (BA), Bachelor of Science (BS). Additional course recommendations can be made for students considering teaching German or the BA degree.

**Teaching German (BS in Ed degree):** Students need a “C” or higher in COM 115 (OTC’s COM105), EDC 150 (OTC’s EDU 110) & IMT 365 (OTC’s EDU 225). For full admission into any public teacher certification program, students must also have a 2.5 or higher combined, cumulative, GPA, a 265 on all sections of the C-Base examination, ACT scores on file (if required by the state), a Highway Patrol background check and complete portfolio checkpoint #1.

**Bachelor of Arts (BA degree):** Students will also need HST 103 & 104 (OTC’s HST 105 & 106), a philosophy course (OTC’s PHL 101 or 105, *not* 110 because it transfers as a religion course) and six hours of fine arts courses (pick two from OTC’s ART 101 or 105; ENG 200, 220, 225, 240 or 245; MUS 101; THR 101)
