OTC offers several courses in CRJ that will transfer to Missouri State and **will** be accepted toward the 18 hours of criminology electives needed for this major. Students should be aware of Missouri State's residence requirements before making final course selections. Residence requirements are described in our printed or online undergraduate catalog, and can be discussed with a Missouri State University Academic Advisor. Students must have a total of 40 upper-division hours including 12 hours of upper-division credit in CRM administered through Missouri State University.
