- 5. "Real Seminar" experiences for students (interactions/group experiences if situations allow)



Item(s) Chosen for Action

- 1. Share scope and sequence, content covered in class with faculty in department
- 2. Collaborative teaching based on students' needs
- 3. Get additional feedback, perceptions and thoughts from our graduate students.



Follow-up Plans & Next Steps

- 1. Conduct departmental meetings to facilitate interdisciplinary collaboration
- 2. Develop program learning outcomes
- 3. Collect feedback from current graduate students regarding their learning experiences in the graduate seminar
- 4. Conduct SWOT analysis to improve the seminar based on students' feedback
- 5. Develop a guideline in seminar course development



Items that Need Action at Higher Levels than the Department

- 1. Offer more research opportunities for students that include collaboration with other departments
- 2. Create and post learning outcomes for the Kinesiology Department
- Consider what format of graduate seminar should be (elective vs. required)
