Scholarships for Students with Intellectual/Developmental Disabilities:

Google Lime Scholarship for Students with Disabilities This scholarship award is a nonrenewable amount of \$10,000 granted by Google for students with disabilities that require long-term or recurring support, impacting that impact one or more major activities of daily living.

<u>Microsoft DisAbility Scholarship</u> This scholarship award is a nonrenewable amount of \$5,000 for students pursuing engineering, computer science, computer information systems, law, or business.

Allina Health Scholarship for People with Disabilities This scholarship award is \$1,000, and assists students with sensory impairments or physical disabilities.

Marion Huber Learning Through Listening Awards This scholarship award is \$6,000 and is available to active subscribers of Learning Ally, who have added one book to their Learning Ally bookshelf within the last 12 months. The three top winners will be presented with their awards at the National Achievement Awards Gala, Learning Ally's annual Student Success and Achievement Summit in the spring of each year. The deadline to apply is May 31, 2018.

Scholarships for Students with Autism:

Avonte Oquendo Memorial Scholarship This scholarship offers \$1,000. Named for a 14-year-old boy with autism who wandered away from school, and did not make it home, this scholarship is for high-achieving students diagnosed with autism or who have a close family member with autism. Applicants must be currently enrolled or accepted to an accredited university or college.

Kelly Law Team Autism Scholarship This scholarship offers two \$1,000 awards to students with autism. Applicants submit an inspirational essay explaining how the scholarship will benefit them. Stories are placed on the Kelly Law Team website and winners are selected based on which story receives the most attention.

KFM Making a Difference This scholarship offers \$500. It was created by Kerry Magro, a motivational speaker with autism, in the hopes of providing educational access to those with autism.

<u>Organization for Autism Research</u> This scholarship offers two, nonrenewable scholarships of \$3,000 for students on the autism spectrum from the Organization for Autism Research.

Scholarships for Students with Down Syndrome:

<u>Ruby's Rainbow</u> Ruby's Rainbow offers scholarships of \$3,000 - \$5,000 per awarded individual, subject to available funds for each year. The Maudie's scholarship is up to \$4,000 and is awarded to one select applicant per year. This is an individual chosen by Maudie's after reviewing all scholarship applications.

<u>Down Syndrome Aim High Resource Center Scholarship</u> This scholarship is offered in the \$250-\$2000 rage. One scholarship is offered to a student with Down syndrome each year who is going for vocational training or post-secondary education. This scholarship is offered only to students living in NY State.

National Down Syndrome Society O'Neill/Tabani Enrichment Fund Offers five \$2,000 scholarships nationally to students with Down syndrome who are pursuing postsecondary education. Applications are closed for the 2011 year. Applications for the 2012 year open up in late May/Early June. Information will be posted on this page.

<u>Band of Angels Scholarship</u> (Amount of scholarship not listed) Scholarship is offered nationally for students with Down syndrome who are pursuing post-high school education.

<u>Down Syndrome Footprint Scholarship</u> (Amount of scholarship can change) Scholarship is offered nationally for students with Down syndrome who are pursuing post-high school education. Students in their last year of high school who plan to pursue a post-secondary education are encouraged to apply.

<u>United Parent Support for Down Syndrome Scholarship</u> Six \$2,500 scholarships are awarded nationally for students with Down syndrome pursuing vocational or post-secondary options.
