1 2.27% Everyone in the Honors College Office, Financial Aid, and many other offices have been very friendly and helpful.

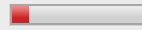

Needless to say, I feel like they were unorganized and should have told me earlier that I wouldn't get to pick my roommate, or to sign up by a certain date to pick my roommate.
