## HIGHLIGHTS OF RESULTS OF FRESHMAN SURVEY COOPERATIVE INSTITUTIONAL RESEARCH PROGRAM (CIRP) FALL 1999 THROUGH FALL 2005 FIRST-TIME FRESHMEN

The following are highlights selected from results of CIRP surveys, submitted by first-time freshmen at Missouri State. The methods for administering the survey are as follows: fall 1999 and fall 2000 - completed during IDS and UCH 110 classes the first week of the semester and collected after class, fall 2001 - completed during academic advisement session at SOAR and collected by SOAR leaders after session, fall 2002 through fall 2005 - distributed to students during first day of SOAR and requested to return the next day. The fall 2005 sample size is small due to the fact that the survey was not distributed to all students who attended SOAR as in the previous three years. Also included are data for all students surveyed nationally at four-year public colleges and universities.
