3. Nominations for the Eric Shade Award are open now; we have extended the deadline for nominations until February 15. The award was initiated to recognize those who "demonstrate significant commitment to the principles of faculty governance within the university. Nominees should be able to document a record of sustained excellence and substantial contributions to faculty governance through service in Faculty Senate and on Senate committees over a period of years."

Eligibility: Any current fulltime faculty member not serving as an administrator may be nominated for the award.

Nomination Process: Individuals may be nominated by other faculty members or may nominate themselves. Once nominated, a faculty member will be asked to submit to the Faculty Senate Chair a 1-2 page letter outlining their contributions to faculty governance, a CV listing service in Senate and on Senate committees, and the names of 2-3 references who can speak to the quality of the nominee's service. Faculty Senate Officers will select the award winner. The annual award winner will have their name placed on a permanent plaque to be displayed in Carrington Hall and will receive a \$500 cash award.

Deadline: Nominations must be submitted to the Faculty Senate Chair by February 15. Nominees will be contacted by February 20. Nominees must submit a letter, CV, and names of three references by February 27. Given the short turn-around time, it may be a good idea for those nominating anyone other than themselves to give a verbal notification to their nominee/s so that they can begin working on their applications. The award will be announced at a spring session of the Faculty Senate and presented at the University's spring awards ceremony.
