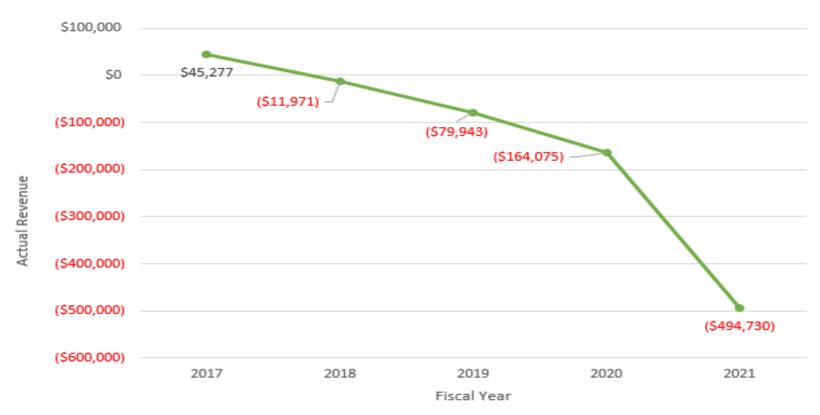

 - Seven SCUF Central proposals = \$1,387,955
 - Eleven other proposals = \$835,716

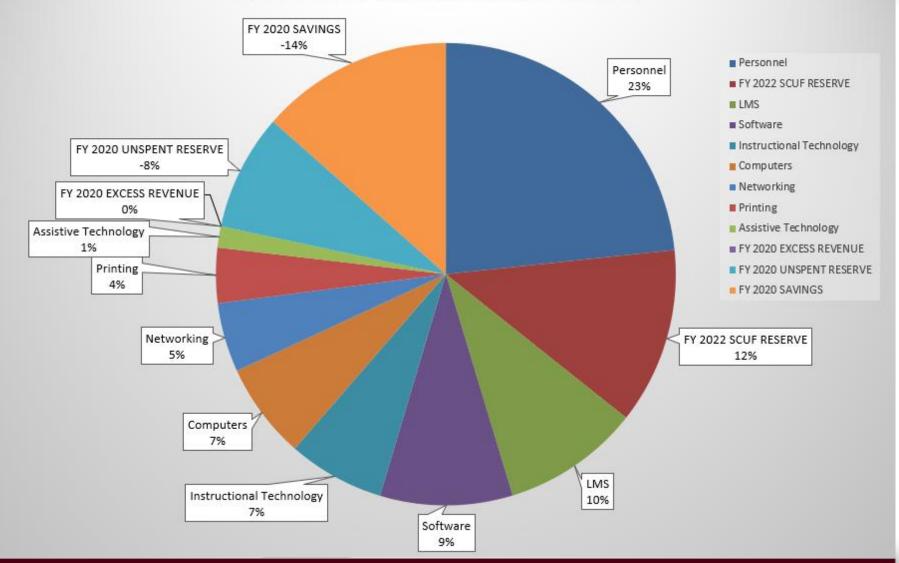

Discussion Points



Student Wages

- Minimum wage in Missouri
 - Increased 85 cents per hour to \$10.30 on January 1, 2021
 - On January 1, 2022, the enacted increase is 85 cents per hour to \$11.15
 - On January 1, 2023, the enacted increase is 85 cents per hour to \$12.00
- SCUF FUNDED STUDENT WORKERS (in dollars per hour)

	FY 2022	FY 2021	Change
Category I	11.15	10.30	0.85
Category II	11.90	11.05	0.85
Category III	12.85	12.00	0.85

- SCUF FUNDED STUDENT WORKERS (in hours)
 - FY 21 SCUF funds 41,020 hours of student employees
 - FY 22 Proposes funding 40,622 hours of student employees



Observations

- Utilization of prior year savings in the current budget year has eased the burden, this year
- This is "kicking the can down the road" Increasing costs are still a concern
- It is hoped a change in the university fee structure will be granted by the state. This may yield an increase to SCUF revenue.
