2. Grammarly Program Update – SGA Initiative

We have 178 students out of the 200 who are participating, and there are talks to extend this piloted program into Spring 2023. There is a student feedback form available, and the launch is going well.

SGA has discussed possibly adding laptops in the library for checking out. There is help needed with funding, as some of the devices are more in demand than others.

Also, putting a color printer in the PSU is another item the SGA has discussed. Terry Weber has donated some space but then we have concerns such as staffing, click to print, not free, possibly a QR code to print with. Theresa McCoy suggested her and Becca to connect and discuss options.

4. SCUF Computer Purchase

6. Learning Management System (LMS)

The provost's office has requested an evaluation of the current learning management system, Blackboard Learn, that is being used and supported by the university. The current contract with Anthology, the parent company for Blackboard, will be up for renewal June 30, 2022. The university will be entering into a one-year extension to allow time for this evaluation and possible migration of LMS platforms. This review will provide the opportunity to reconsider faculty and student learning management needs and evaluate possible alternatives (including Blackboard Ultra, Canvas, and D2L Brightspace).

7. Campus Outages – Update

On the morning of November 10, 2022, a pipe failure over the data center in the Blair-Shannon residence hall caused the loss of internet connectivity for Missouri State University and other public agencies within southwest Missouri. The failure was immediately found by network and telecommunications staff and mitigation efforts began. Senior leadership of facilities management and information services were on scene within 15 minutes of the failure and five minutes later, the notification of senior leadership began.

The first Missouri State Alert to the campus was issued one hour after the pipe failure. Texting was the primary mode of communication both individually, and eventually text groups were created and used to communicate to the Policy Group and to the Deans. Microsoft Teams was the primary mode of communication between Information Services staff. Limited internet was restored by 2:52 p.m. and full restoration occurred at 6:08 p.m.

However, it also identified many things that needed improvement, and an action plan is in place.
