The Institute of Internal Auditors (The IIA)

- **Mission of The IIA - To provide dynamic leadership for the global profession of internal auditing.**
 - **Advocating** and **promoting** the **value of internal audit professionals** add to their organizations.
 - **Providing** comprehensive professional **educational and development opportunities, standards, and other professional practice guidance, and certification programs.**
 - **Researching, disseminating, and promoting knowledge** concerning internal auditing and its appropriate role in **control risk management, and governance** to practitioners and stakeholders.
 - **Educating** practitioners and other relevant audiences on **best practices** in internal auditing.
 - **Bringing together** internal auditors **from all countries** to share information and experiences.

Internal Audit Awareness Program

- Recognizes various degrees of commitment and effort universities are making to provide students with information and skill sets necessary to choose from a variety of career paths (i.e. internal auditor).

- **Internal Auditing Education Partnership Program (IAEP)**

- Endorses universities teaching an internal audit curriculum within a degree program (undergraduate or post-graduate).

Internal Audit Awareness Program (IAAP)

- **Benefits of the IAAP**
 - Universities participating in the IAAP have access to various materials and resources, including the opportunity to apply for funding via the Internal Audit Foundation IAEP Grant Program.
 - Enhanced opportunities to network with other educators teaching internal auditing to share ideas and materials.
 - Employers consult The IIA's list of universities teaching internal auditing as they consider the degree of internal audit education they seek for their new hires.
 - Guest speakers may be provided upon request.



Internal Audit Awareness Program (IAAP)

- **Process for Recognition in the IAAP**
 1. External academic accreditation is required to participate - The Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business International (AACSB).
 1. Match existing syllabi with that suggested in The IIA Global Model Internal Auditing Curriculum.
 1. Contact your local IIA Chapter or Affiliate - They can be a great resource to assist with the process.
 - If there isn't a local IIA Chapter in your area, please contact Academic Relations at The IIA's Global Headquarters.
 1. Complete The IIA Request for Recognition Form
 - Contact your local IIA Chapter or Academic Relations at The IIA's Global Headquarters.
 - *Acceptance to the program will be communicated to the university and local IIA Chapter within 60 days of receipt of request.*
 1. The university is required to annually validate the information provided in its application to verify the program is still in compliance with the IAAP criteria.
 - *Awareness universities are required to complete an annual report provided by The IIA Academic Relations team.*



Internal Audit Education Partnership Program (IAEP)

- Developed to respond to growing interest in internal audit education.
- Addresses general need of practitioners interested in hiring students who possess a well-rounded skill set for conducting internal auditing.
- Prepares students with skills and knowledge to help them conduct basic internal audits immediately upon hire.
- Prepares students for the Certified Internal Auditor (CIA) exam.
- IAEP schools teach internal auditing curriculum within a degree program (undergraduate or post-graduate) endorsed by The IIA.



Internal Audit Education Partnership Program (IAEP)

- **General**

- Comprehensive five-year business plan is required. A letter of support from dean/department head is required.
- Curriculum is expected to remain in good standing and undergo re-endorsement after five years. IAEP participation requires commitment from the university and the local IIA chapter.

- **Faculty**

- IAEP Coordinator can be an appropriately qualified adjunct professor or professional staff member (full-time educator is preferred) and be a CIA.
- Person overseeing internal audit curriculum must approach from an academic point of view to ensure learning outcomes and objectives are developed/updated regularly.
- Internal Audit course(s) instructor must be a CIA or appropriately qualified instructor.
- Curriculum vitae for all instructors in the program must be included in application, including internal audit experience, relevant credentials, & professional memberships).



Internal Audit Education Partnership Program (IAEP)

- **Internal Auditing Curriculum**
 - Application must include proposed internal audit curriculum and must be part of the university's official academic catalog and courses must be credit bearing.
 - Students who complete approved curriculum are eligible to receive a completion certificate from The IIA Global Headquarters.
- **Student Internships or Equivalent Work Experience**
 - Application should describe internal audit-related internship or practical work experience opportunities and organization providing them.
- **Advisory Board**
 - Existence of a separate Internal Audit advisory board that included members from local IIA chapter is preferred.
 - Application should describe existing advisory board and internal audit representation.



Internal Audit Education Partnership Program (IAEP)

- **Internal Audit Student Organization**
 - Participation in an internal audit student organization is recommended.
- **The IIA Chapter Involvement**
 - Application should document various types of support The IIA Chapter has agreed to provide. A Board of Governors' resolution (supports the proposed IAEP program) is required.
- **Accreditation/International Reputation**
 - Appropriate international accreditation or recognition is required.
 - Accreditation through internationally recognized bodies is preferred (i.e. AACSB).

- **Mission**

IAEP Grant Program

- **Qualifications**

- Universities that have not yet entered the IAEP program, but have **attained classification of Awareness School** may apply for grants to support their advances and entrance into the IAEP program.
- IAEP institutions at the Foundation, Comprehensive, and Center of Excellence levels may apply.
- IAEP schools may apply for grants in all qualified categories, but will only **be awarded up to three categories each grant cycle** not to exceed \$10,000 annually.
- Application window is open **through October 15 each year**.

The Foundation awards grants in the following categories:

Category	Description
Category 1 – Sustainability & Advancement	Proposals in this category must include activities that will assist a program in retaining or advancing their level within the IAEP program.
Category 2 – Student Engagement	Proposals within this category should focus on increasing the student’s engagement with the profession and can be used to support student organizations and participation in student events for example.
Category 3 – IAEP Advocate/Graduate Assistant	To qualify for funding, the school and advocate must commit to fulfillment of the advocate responsibilities during the grant term.
Category 4 – Educator Development	Proposals within this category support the development of IAEP educators and can be used to ensure that professors are up to date with the practice of internal auditing.
Category 5 - Student Scholarships	Proposals in this category are considered only for those schools with restricted funds available in the Foundation’s Academic Fund. Donors must contribute to the Foundation’s Academic Fund and indicate the restriction for scholarships at a named school at the time of contribution. Scholarships MUST be administered through the designated school.

The IIA's Student Membership

- **Benefits**
 - Student's gain access to numerous resources - mentorships, content, tools, and training.
 - **Membership is free!!**
- **Eligibility**
 - Must be currently enrolled in an undergraduate or graduate program, part-time or full-time, with a minimum of six (6) credits at a college or university.
 - Must provide evidence annually of part-time/full-time status by submitting an official transcript for the current semester.
 - Student membership is limited to a maximum of six (6) years.
- **How to Apply**
 - Students sign in to their MyIIA portal and complete the Student Program Application.
 - IIA Staff will review the application for approval.
 - Once approved, the student will receive a confirmation email and their student status will be activated.



The IIA's Internal Audit Practitioner Designation

- **Benefits**
 - Opens a new pathway to the Certified Internal Auditor (CIA) designation (the only globally recognized certification for internal audit practitioners around the world).
 - Graduating with the Internal Audit Practitioner designation reflects a student's commitment to entering the profession with the fundamental knowledge needed to being contributing immediately.
- **Program Overview**
 - Five (5) syllabus domains, each dealing with a set of IIA Standards.
 - 2-hour exam, 100 multiple-choice questions.
 - Testing Center or Online Testing
 - Two (2) years to complete once approved.
 - Three (3) years to designation validity after passing.
 - Three (3) years to enroll in the CIA exam.
 - 100 self-study practice questions included with approved application.

- As The IIA's premier designation for more than 40 years, the CIA sets the standard for excellence within the profession. Earning the CIA is an important step toward demonstrating your core internal audit skills and knowledge.

- Hold an active Internal Audit Practitioner designation, or
- Possess five years of internal audit experience, or
- Be an active student in your final year of college, or *
- Be an active student with an approved Internal Audit Education Partnership (IAEP) school.*

CIA Challenge Exam

- The CIA Challenge Exam is your chance to join the more than 185,000 CIAs who have achieved this highly respected global certification.
- As an active CPA or CA holder, you can take advantage of this limited opportunity to earn the Certified Internal Auditor[®] (CIA[®]) designation through an expedited process called the CIA Challenge Exam. This expedited process allows you to obtain the CIA designation after successfully passing the one-part examination.
- The CIA Challenge Exam only includes content not covered on your CPA or CA exam, saving you time and money.
