An article in this newsletter brought back many memories. SWMSNA was a lot less formal back then. Basically, the presentation of our certificates of training was in the Anesthesia office before the day's surgery cases started. Being on call at Cox Hospital across town, up most of the night and finishing up an early morning emergency Csection on Graduation Day, I was running late getting back to St.John's. So as I said, graduation was a lot less formal back then.






