


SILVA SCHOLARSHIP

MSU School of Anesthesia Faculty and Staff

Specially Trained CRNA Advocates for Profession

Colonel David Johnson is an MSU School of Anesthesia completion student working toward his Doctorate of Nurse Anesthesia degree. He is the Director of Medical Operations for Air Force Special Operations Command and the Chief Nurse for the Command. He has two Medical Groups in his area of leadership. In a recent power point presentation to recruit nurses/ CRNAs, Johnson highlighted the Special Operations Surgical Teams (SOST). SOST is a risk mitigation tool for Geographic Combatant Commands (GCC)/Theater Special Operations Commands (TSOC). The strategic capability of the SOST extends the Department of Defense reach in Declared Theater of Armed Conflict (DTAC) and Outside Declared Theater of Armed Conflict



(ODTAC) environments. It extends the traditional "Golden-Hour" as far forward as the mission requires.

Employment for SOST:

-Specifically organized, trained, and equipped to support the full spectrum of Special Operations Forces (SOF) missions

-Capability to conduct Defense Collaboration Services/Designated Crisis Responders in High Threat environments

-Can support from Point-of-Injury to next level care - Outside the Wire

-Designed to support High Risk, High Profile, and/or Strategically Sensitive Operations

-Team composition and equipment can be tailored to meet specific mission requirements

-Core SOF Skills - Core Special Tactics capability (Battlefield Surgery) -Forward link to theater medical system; requires non-SOF support

-Stationed at Level-1 Trauma Centers - maintains clinical skills; conduct "Team Trauma Calls"


In addition to advocating for his profession, being a CRNA has also meant a great deal to Johnson personally. His son was wounded in Iraq. Several of his CRNA friends helped take care of him. "He had awesome care throughout his recovery which carried all the way back to Brooke Army Hospital in San Antonio," Johnson said. "My son lost both his legs in Iraq, but he has been cared for repeatedly over the years by CRNAs that trained me or that have worked with me."

Johnson is passionate about his profession. "I am shamelessly always trying to recruit nurses to CRNA school and Air Force CRNAs to Special Operations. It is the most rewarding job anyone can ever have," he said.
