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Learning Outcomes Review

EXISTING MSU REL MASTUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES

- Students will develop advanced knowledge in one or more scholarly fields in the study of religion.
- Students will utilize theories and methods appropriate for graduate research in the study of religion.
- Students will demonstrate critical thinking, analytical, and interpretive skills appropriate for graduate research in religion.
- Students will communicate effectively both orally and in writing.



Data Discussed

COMPARISON WITH OTHER STAND-ALONE REL MA PROGRAMS IN STATE UNIVERSITIES

- Team researched and discussed SLOs/program descriptions from 13 other programs
- Other programs haphazardly imply some SLOs in program descriptions but don't systematically and clearly articulate them.
- Undergraduate programs are more frequently intentional about articulating SLOs than graduate programs.



Conclusions Reached

- Our existing SLOs are a good start but should be more detailed and example rich in terms of the subjects, methods, and skills to be mastered.
- Some Religious Studies undergraduate program SLOs provide good examples for emulation.
- Our efforts to provide more specificity in SLOs will contribute to the development an effective exit survey/interview for program assessment.
- Our department could become a leader in promoting the importance of clearly articulating SLOs for Religious Studies MA programs



Degree Paths Review

EXISTING MSU REL MA PATHS

- Students can do a thesis or a research portfolio.
- All students take comprehensive exams that emphasize breadth of knowledge—multiple subject areas—in the study of religion.



Data Discussed

COMPARISON WITH OTHER STAND-ALONE REL MA PROGRAMS IN STATE SCHOOLS

- The team researched and discussed degree paths of the other programs, esp. w/regard to comprehensive exams
 - Programs that require a thesis of everyone and no comps: 1
 - Programs that require a thesis or more electives and no comps: 1
 - Programs that require a thesis or more electives and comps: 5
 - Programs that require a thesis or a research portfolio and no comps: 2
 - Programs that require a thesis or a research portfolio and comps: 2



Conclusions Reached

- We need to do something. ©
- We might want to drop comps for thesis track students or everyone.
- More consensus emerged on modifying the comprehensive exam by making it field specific rather than general.
- A field specific comp would actually contribute to thesis or research portfolio prep.

- 1. Modify SLOs
- 2. Modify Comps
