Programming Report

(Trainings, Outreach, Education, and Programming)

SOAR Parent Presentations (June 7-August 15, 2019) –Assistant Dean of Students and Director of Student Conduct, Dr. Andrea Weber, and Assistant Director of Student Conduct, Chris Hanna, in collaboration with representatives from the Springfield Police Department and Missouri State University’s Office of University Safety facilitated brief presentations to parents twice weekly on policies, safety and behavioral expectations for prospective students.

Clery Act Training (June 27-28, 2019) - D. Stafford & Associates facilitated a two-day training on Foundations of Clery Act Compliance for campus staff. The training was attended by Chris Hanna, Assistant Director of Student Conduct and other university partners.

Hall Director Training (August 2019, January 2020) – Assistant Dean of Students and Director of Student Conduct, Dr. Andrea Weber and Assistant Director of Student Conduct, Chris Hanna, facilitated three trainings for hall staff on adjudicating conduct cases and use of the conduct database, Maxient.

Tabling (Monthly) - The Office of Student Conduct aims to ensure that students are educated on how to uphold the values of Missouri State University’s Public Affairs mission. In that vein we consistently provide information about the Code of Student Rights and Responsibilities to students to help students avoid violations and ensure that they are demonstrating good citizenship. The Assistant Director, Chris Hanna, and Graduate Assistant, David Gambino led those efforts, which were hosted in the Plaster Student Union.

West Plains Residence Life Training (August 1st, 2020) – Assistant Dean of Students and Director of Student Conduct, Dr. Andrea Weber, facilitated a training for the West Plains Director of Residence Life and Coordinator of Student Life and Development on conduct practices and policies as well as Maxient training.

B.E.A.R. Fair (August 13, 2019) - Residence Life Student Leader Training Committee hosted a resource fair providing an opportunity for the Office of Student Conduct to disseminate information to student leaders. The fair was aimed at helping students to become more familiar with resources on campus and identifying educational and social community development opportunities.

Bears for a Just Community-LLC Welcome Social (August 16th, 2020) – Office of Student Conduct staff serve as partners for the Bears for a Just Community. Staff attended the opening social.

Belong B-Q (August 18, 2019) - The Belong-B-Q is Multicultural Services major event during *Welcome Weekend*. A combination cookout, information fair, and performance, the Belong-B-Q showcases the wide range of diverse student organizations and resources here at Missouri State University. The Office of Student Conduct used this opportunity to engage with student and share information about our office.

Men's Basketball Team (August 20th, 2020) – Assistant Dean of Students and Director of Student Conduct Dr. Andrea Weber presented the Code of Student Rights and Responsibilities to the Men's Basketball team and answered questions.

BEAR Power Training (September 5th, 2020) – Assistant Dean of Students and Director of Student Conduct Dr. Andrea Weber facilitated a training with BEAR Power staff on Maxient utilization.

Panhellenic Council Judicial Board Hearing Training (September 23rd, 2020) – Assistant Dean of Students and Director of Student Conduct Dr. Andrea Weber trained the Panhellenic Chief Justice on how to run a recruitment rules hearing.

West Plains Behavioral Intervention Team (October 1st, 2020) – Assistant Dean of Students and Director of Student Conduct Dr. Andrea Weber co-facilitated a training with the West Plains BIT Team.

Inclusive Excellence Course Presentation (October 1, 2019) – Chris Hanna, Assistant Director for the Office of Student Conduct facilitated a presentation for the Inclusive Excellence Scholarship and Award Program on the conduct process, the office's functions, and how students can demonstrate civility on our campus.

IDS 120 Course Presentations (October 2, 2019 & March 11, 2020) - Chris Hanna, Assistant Director for the Office of Student Conduct facilitated a presentation to Interdisciplinary Studies course participants on the conduct process, role of the office, Code of Student Rights and Responsibilities, and the impact of conduct violations.

International Center for Academic Integrity (October 16, 2019) - Under the auspices of the International Center for Academic Integrity, the Office of Student Conduct partnered with the Academic Integrity to host the 4th *International Day of Action Against Contract Cheating*. The offices tabled in the PSU and engaged with students about the Code of Student Rights and Responsibilities. Students also got an opportunity to make “white board declarations”, obtain information about resources on campus, learn about the conduct process (academic and non-academic), and receive incentives.

MSU Jeopardy (October 16, 2019) - In collaboration with Academic Integrity, Athletics Department, Student Government Association, Dean of Students Office, Center for Dispute Resolution, and Office of Student Engagement, the Office of Student Conduct hosted a

Jeopardy-style game night as a means of increasing student's learning about the aforementioned offices and their services. Prizes were awarded to 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and 4th place participants.

Trick or Trivia (October 30 & 31, 2019) - The Assistant Director of Student Conduct, Chris Hanna, the Graduate Assistant for Student Conduct, David Gambino, the Green Dot Coordinator, Jenay Divin, representatives from the Springfield Police Department, the Department of Public Safety, students from S.A.D.D (Students against Destructive Decisions) informed members of the campus community about safety. Participating staff wore Halloween costumes and drove around campus in golf carts asking students trivia questions. Students who participated received candy with safety facts on them. This program reached approximately 101 university students and provided them with the opportunity establish positive relationships with involved staff members.

Student Government Judicial Board Training (November 7th, 2020) – Assistant Dean of Students and Director of Student Conduct, Dr. Andrea Weber, facilitated a training for the campus judicial board.

Hearing Board Training (November 8, 2019) – The Office of Student Conduct partnered with the Counseling Center and General Counsel to facilitate a training to hearing board members on Implicit Bias, Motivational Interviewing, the Code of Student Rights and Responsibilities, and the legal aspects of conduct.

Fraternity and Sorority Life Leadership Retreat (January 19, 2020) –Assistant Dean of Students and Director of Student Conduct, Dr. Andrea Weber, facilitated a presentation on the conduct process for members of the Fraternity and Sorority life community. This training included an overview of the Fraternity & Sorority Life Governance Statement and an opportunity for individuals to ask questions about the investigation process.

Association for Student Conduct Administration Conference 2020 (February 5-9, 2020) – Dr. Andrea Weber and Chris Hanna attended the annual ASCA Conference to further enhance our knowledge of the field and remain updated with best practices.

Judicial Board Training (February 12, 2020) – Chris Hanna, Assistant Director for Student Conduct, and Chief Justices facilitated hearing board training to members of the Fraternity and Sorority Life community. Students were provided opportunities to learn more about the process and arm them with the skills to serve as proficient hearing board members.

Civility (PAWS) Initiative (March 1-31, 2020) – The Office of Student Conduct, Partners in Prevention, Residence Life, Green Dot, and Office of Public Affairs partnered to push themes of civility on our campus. The initiative also included an essay contest, tabling events, and media enhancements to allow for themes to be explored by the student body and other stakeholders.

Campus Judicial Board Hearing (March 6th, 2020) – Assistant Dean of Students and Director of Student Conduct, Dr. Andrea Weber, served as the hearing advisor during an elections commission violation.

Civility Tabling (March 4, 11, &18, 2020) - The Office of Student Conduct has consistently aimed to ensure that students are educated on how to uphold the values of Missouri State. The office provided information about the Code of Student Rights and Responsibilities to students to educate them on how to avoid violations and ensure that they are demonstrating good citizenship. Tabling efforts were evaluated at the conclusion of the month to assess efficacy. Our Graduate Assistant, David Gambino led those efforts, which were hosted in the Plaster Student Union.

Safe Spring Break (March 11, 2020) – David Gambino, Graduate Assistant for the Office of Student Conduct, attended the Safe Spring Break event hosted by Fraternity and Sorority Life Social Awareness and Student Wellness. Office staff informed the students of potential dangers associated with certain spring break activities, such as binge drinking, to promote safety for the students. The Office of Student Conduct also discussed the current PAWS Initiative that commenced on March 1st and promoted the essay competition and the pass-it-on activity. Students who engaged with staff had the ability to engage about civility and receive incentives for their participation.
