# ACADEMIC SUPPORT AND INTERNSHIP SEMINAR

### Cohort 4- Transition to Employment:

This month students have worked on their resumes, discovering their network, creating reference pages, and elevator speeches! Sherry Elkins from the Career Center has presented on several of these topics and can provide additional support to our students.

### Cohort 5- Communication and Interpersonal Relationships:

This month we have partnered with an Occupational Therapy (OT) led group that started on February 23rd. The beginning of the semester emphasized self-reflection and discovering individual relationship strategies. Students were introduced to attachment theory and the four types of communication styles: passive, aggressive, assertive, and passive-aggressive. Lyndsi Boysen, a graduate assistant at Bear POWER and a Speech Language Pathologist student, taught verbal and nonverbal communication skills. Students learned various intrapersonal skills such as self-awareness and self-regulation. Around week six, the class shifted focus from individual to group dynamics. Students learned about group thinking and interpersonal skills such as social awareness, empathy, and social skills. As part of the OT group, students created a relationship poster using magazines and other art materials to describe their current relationship. During the Internship Seminar on Mondays, students accomplished several activities such as creating professional email signatures, sending professional emails, creating a reference sheet, researching places to job shadow, and creating resumes. Cohort 5 had another guest speaker, Sherry Elkins, a career resource specialist, who instructed students how to create a resume. Throughout the weeks, students participated in discussions, assignments, and activities that aimed to develop interpersonal, communication, and professional skills to prepare for their internships or future careers.
