Hazing Policies / Article 4: Proscribed Conduct

4.5 Hazing, an act that endangers the mental or physical health or safety of a student, or which destroys or removes public or private property, for the purpose of initiation or admission into, affiliation with or as a condition of continued membership in a group or organization. The express or implied consent of the student will not be a defense to a violation of hazing. The willing participation or acquiescence of the student subject to the hazing activity is no defense and is still a violations of this policy.

Alcohol and Drug Policy / Article 4: Proscribed Conduct

4.11 Use, possession, or distribution of alcoholic beverages or alcohol paraphernalia (as defined in this Code) except as expressly permitted by the law and university regulations, or public intoxication on university premises.

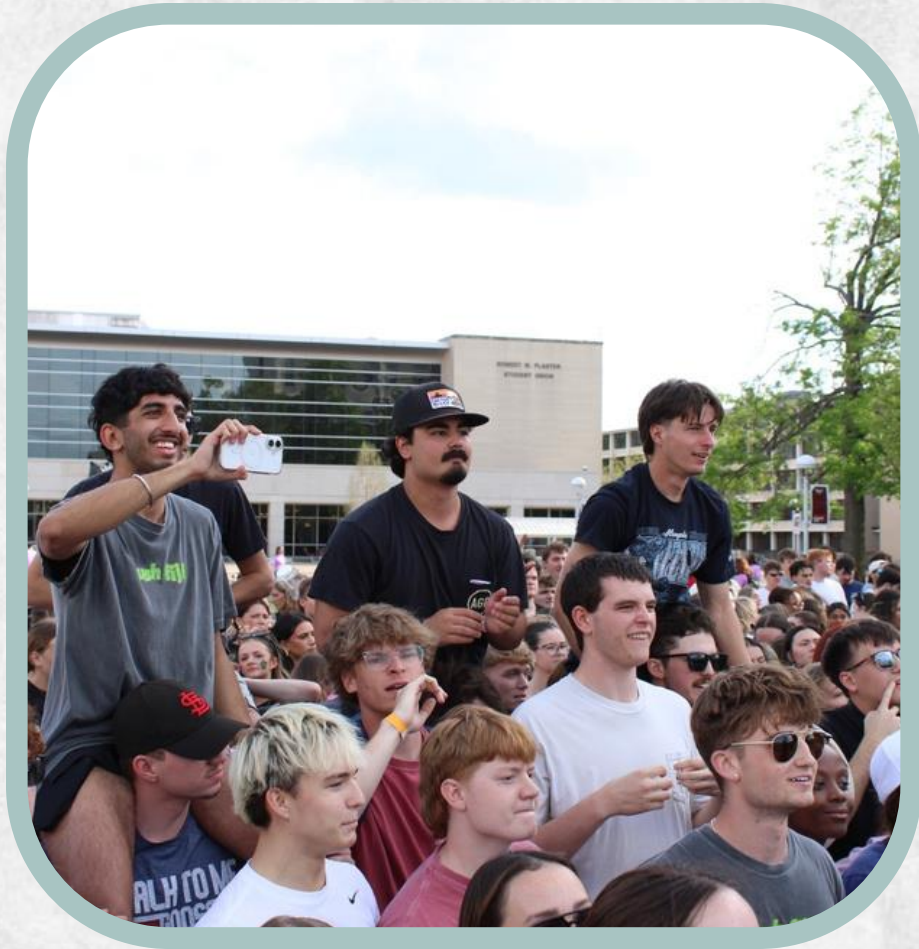

IFC HOUSING

- 12 chapters have chapter houses
- There is typically a one-year live-in requirement
- Average capacity varies by chapter
- Room and board costs \$360–\$645 per month
 - Includes internet, utilities, trash, and parking
 - Some chapters may offer meal plans



IFC RECRUITMENT

- Formal Recruitment Period
 - August 17th
- Informal Recruitment Period
 - August 19th–August 28th
- Bidding Period
 - August 25th–September 4th

(Formal Recruitment is IFC Sponsored Events!)

(Informal Recruitment are chapter sponsored events!)

- What is a bid?
 - A bid is a formal invitation to join a chapter
 - Bids can only be handed out during the bidding period

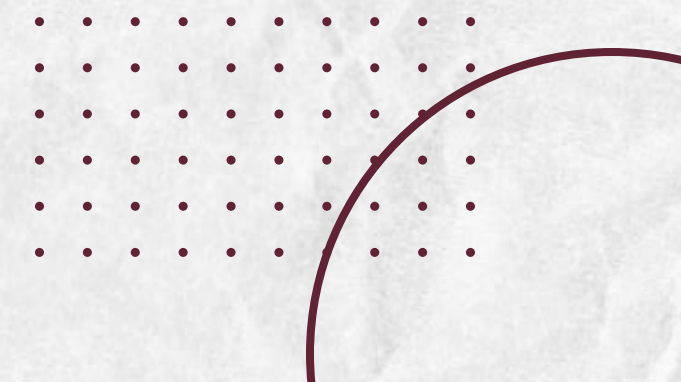
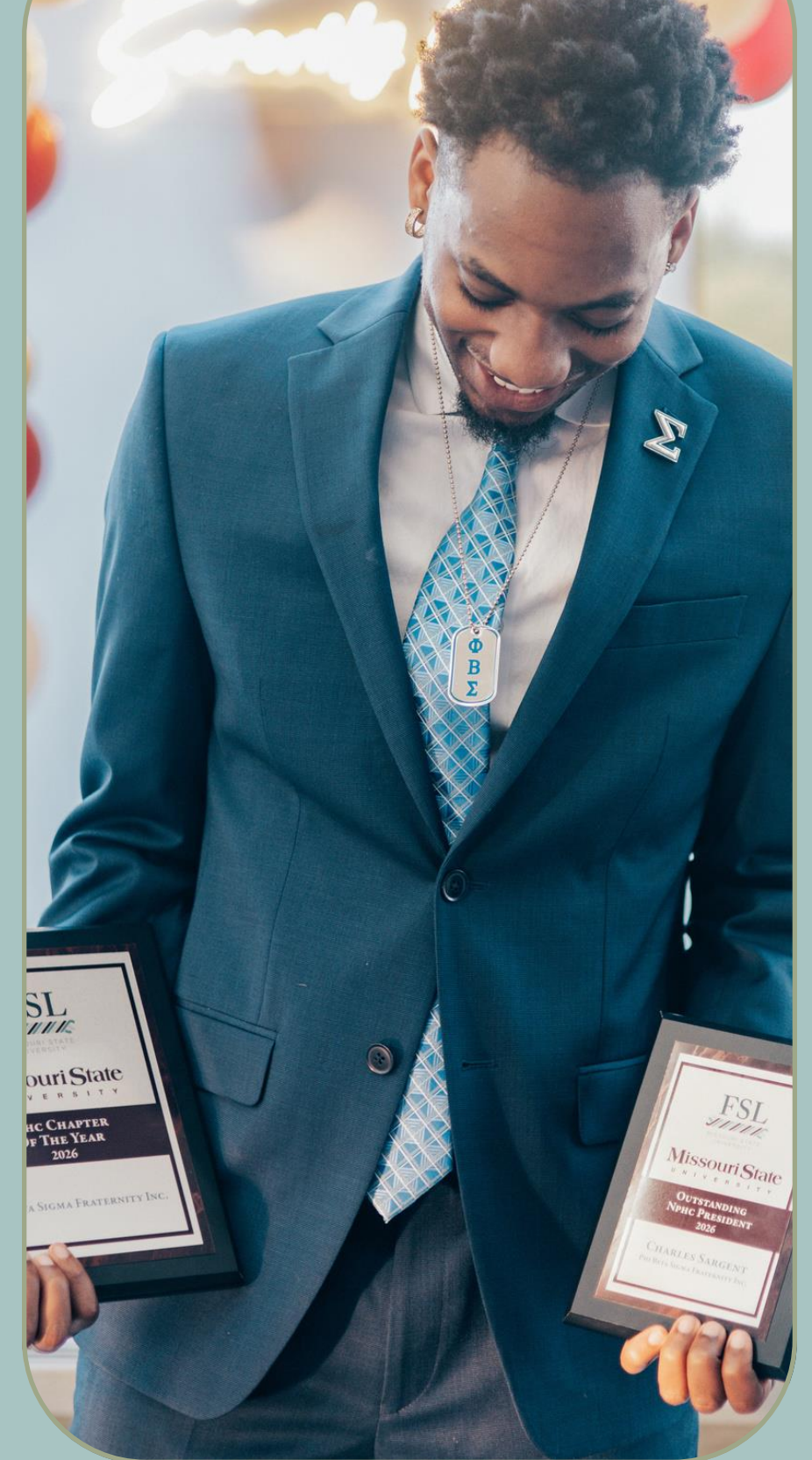

NPHC INTAKE

- Membership intake is the process of selecting, educating and initiating new members into a NPHC chapter. Each chapter conducts intake on an annual basis.
- Discretion and professionalism are very important
- Chapters often require a GPA above 2.5, 12-24 completed college credit hours prior to joining, and letters of recommendation

PHA HOUSING

- There is typically a one-year live-in requirement
- The average capacity of chapter houses is 50
- Room and board cost \$670–\$835 per month
- Includes internet, about 10 meals a week, utilities, trash, and parking
- Each chapter has different pricing structures that they can discuss with you

- Formal Recruitment Period
 - Thursday, August 20th-Sunday August 23rd
- Fee to register for recruitment is \$25 and includes a t-shirt to wear throughout recruitment and meal vouchers

Recruitment Schedule

- Thursday, August 20th: Day 1A (House Tours)
- Friday, August 21st: Day 1B (House Tours)
- Saturday, August 22nd: Day 2 (Sisterhood Day)
- Sunday, August 23rd: Day 3 (Preference Day)
- Monday, August 24th: BID DAY!

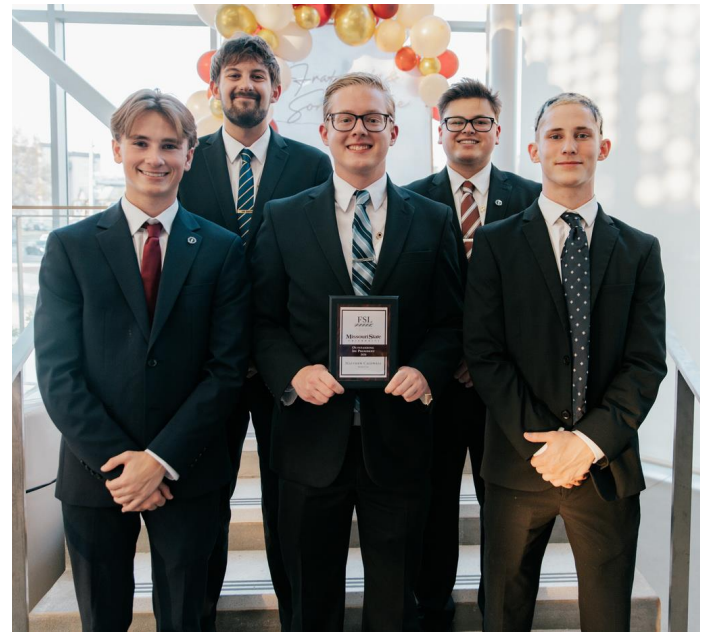
