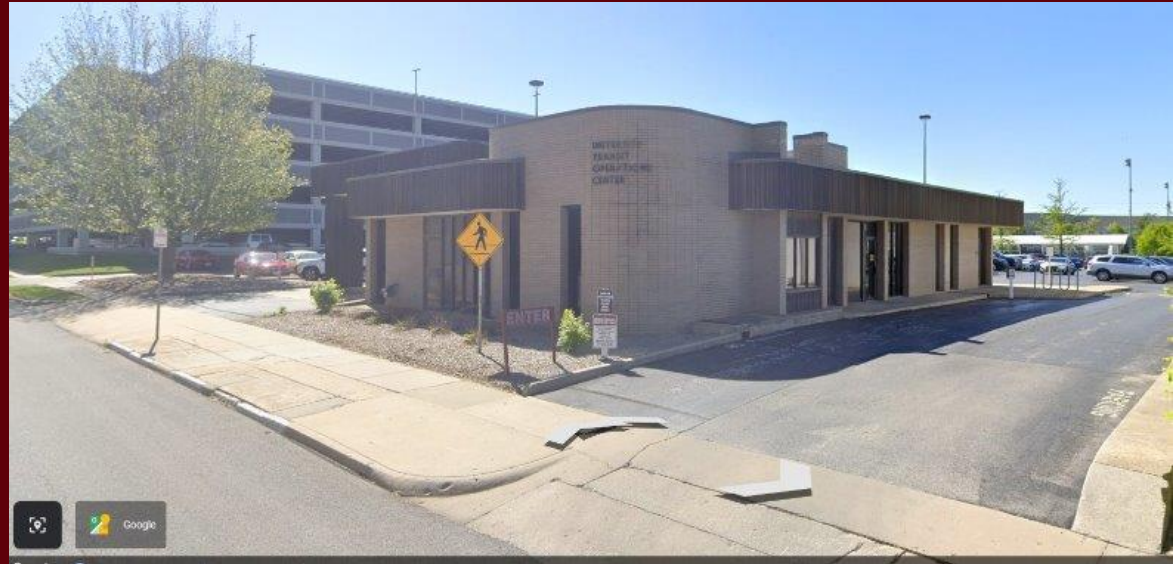


LPR - LICENSE PLATE RECOGNITION SYSTEM

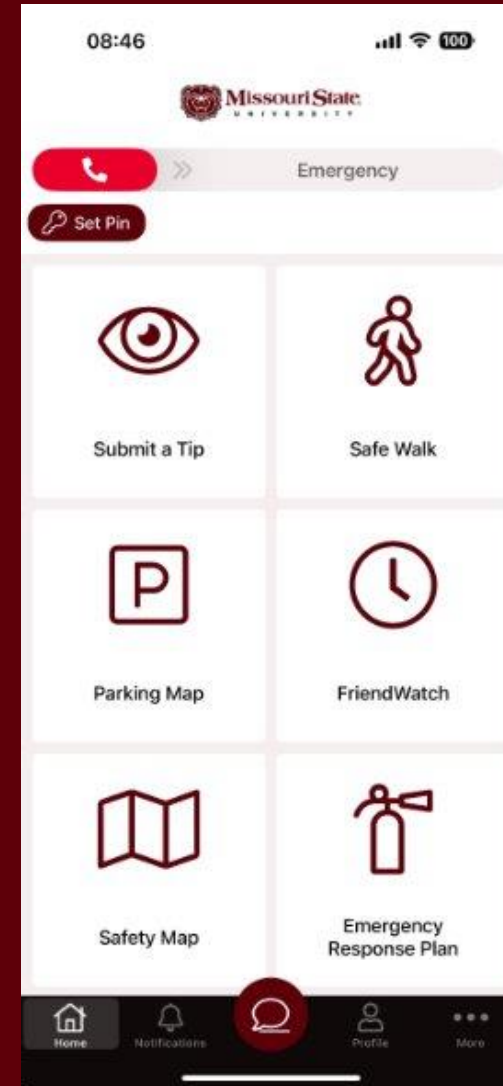

MASS NOTIFICATIONS AND BEAR SHIELD

Missouri State Alert is the mass notification system used to contact students, faculty, staff and the public in the event of an emergency or school closing.

The Bear Shield App is a comprehensive tool for emergencies and everyday safety needs, with panic alerts, live location sharing, two-way communication, and real-time notifications you can access from any iOS or Android mobile device, making it easy to get help, report safety concerns, and stay informed.

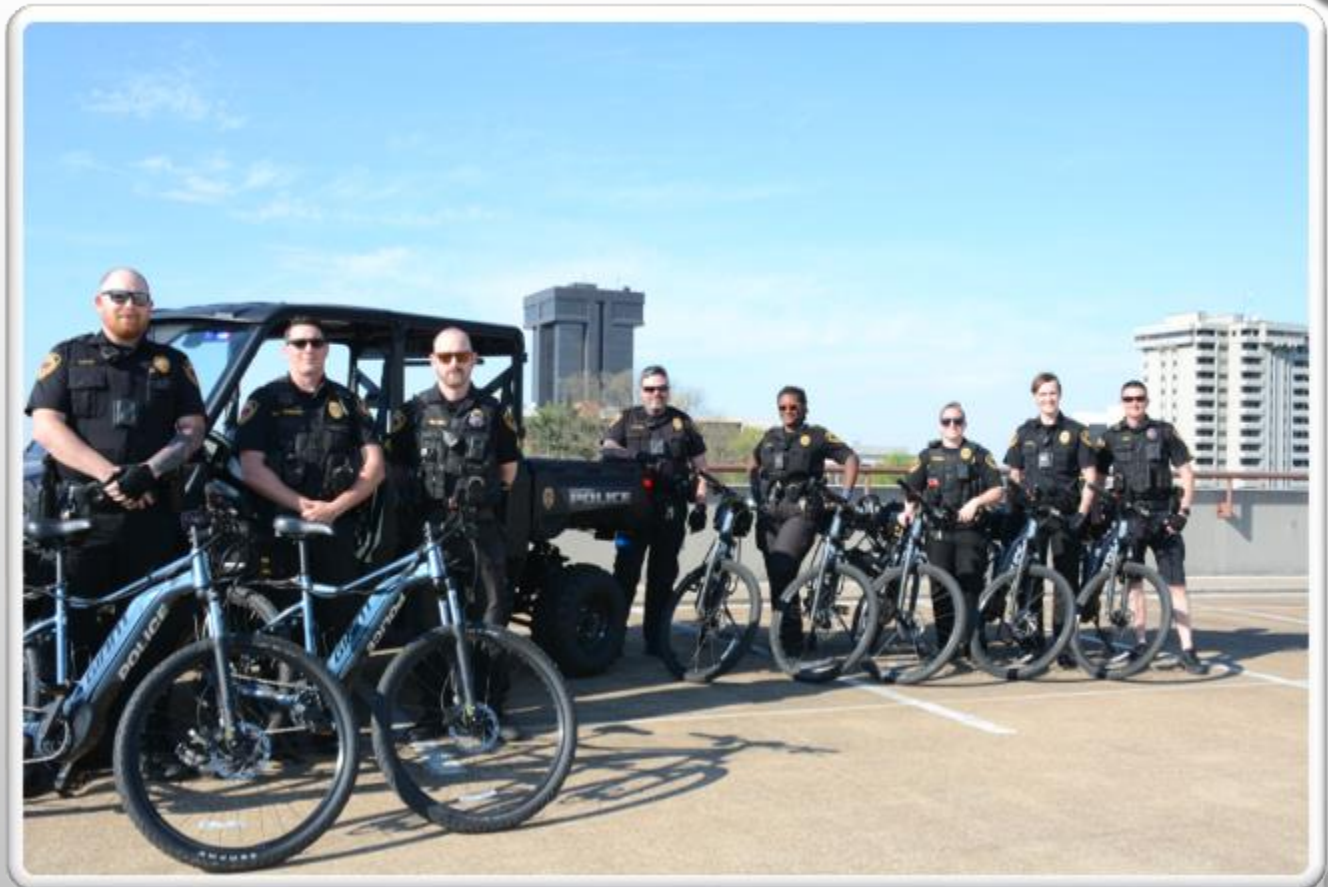




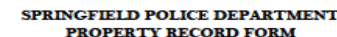
- MSU contracts with the city of Springfield to have 24/7 police coverage on campus

- Have record of serial/item numbers



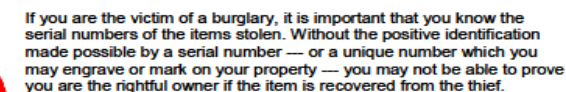

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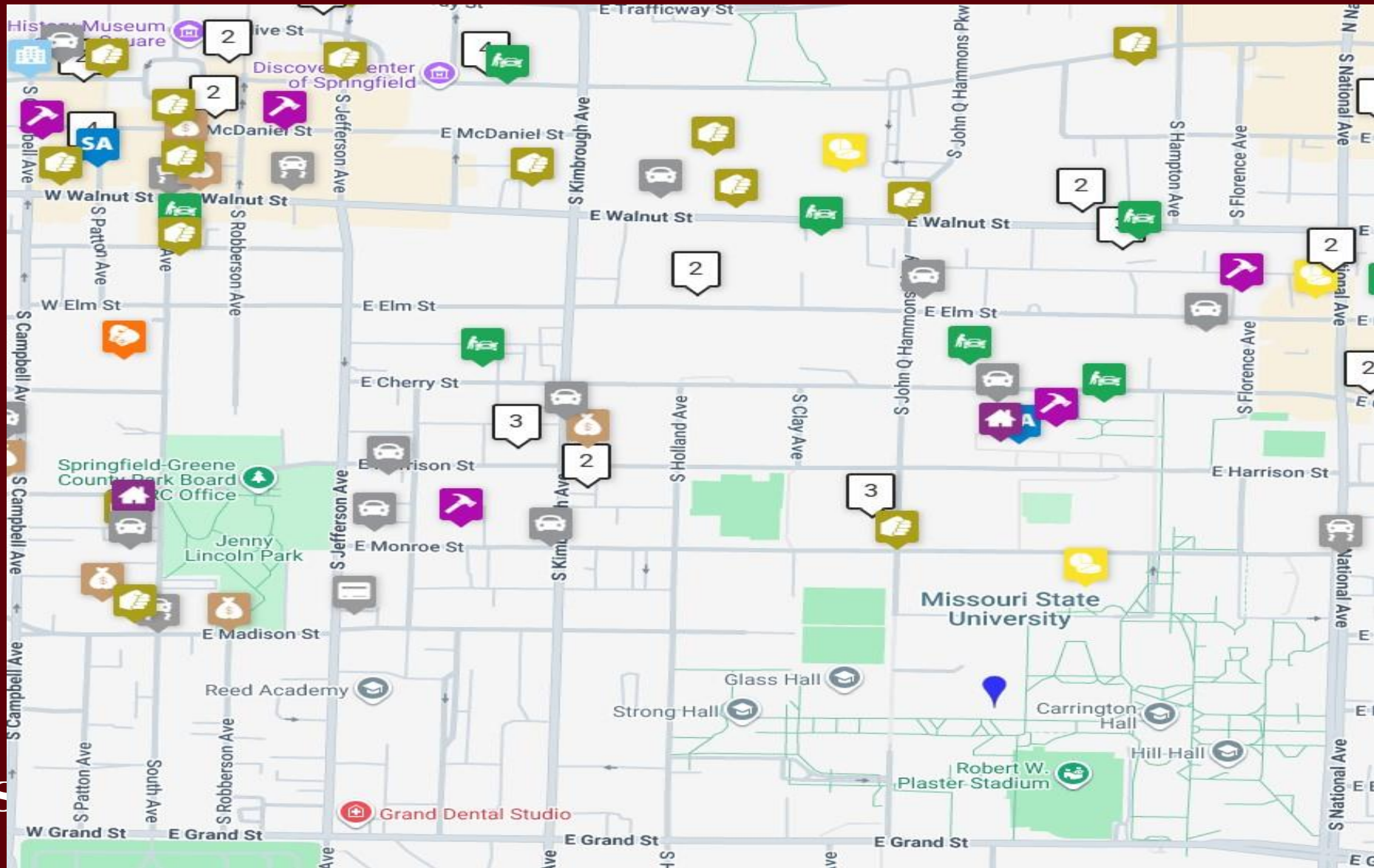
