There is a brief discussion of downgrading scores for tardiness from Smith. The suggestion does not have the support of council members.

4. Update on Core Curriculum Transfer Act (SB 997) - Josh Smith

- i. Smith: Dec.29/Jan 1st MDHE passed Missouri Core 42. Working from a PowerPoint presentation distributed across campus on February 17, Smith provides review of presentation while covering important points with council members, esp. the transferability of credits between Missouri institutions. Also noted is the partial progress we have made toward completing its requirements.
- ii. Walker inquires about student success rate for transfers (2-year to 4-year) and why MSU appears to lag. Smith explains that while some data points are known to us via the enrollment office, we do not have a complete picture. Darabi contributes additional data points regarding OTC.
- iii. Smith responds to additional data questions noting that it should be available soon, and that a mtg. with enrollment is pending for January and reiterating points contained in the presentation.
- iv. Additional discussion focuses on elements of the MSU curriculum that are transferable, no-transferable, and currently being decided and/or altered (this includes some ENG and MTH courses). Smith asks council members to let him know about additional cases of uncertainty or requests to have courses approved for transferability under the program. February 2nd is the next state meeting, and submissions are requested before that time.
- v. Discussion follows at the end of the presentation, including potential impact of the program on enrollment & success, the state of the program, and implementation.
