To be considered for funding, your project should be aligned with the principles of a Scholarship of Teaching and Learning (SoTL) research project, which includes identifying a *problem* or a discipline-based question that is framed around student learning, drawing from research-based strategies, and applying sound methodology and evaluation processes to assess teaching and learning improvements (Bass,1999; Felten, 2013; McKinney, 2007).

All applications for Teaching & Learning Grants will undergo a peer review process conducted by the FCTL Faculty Advisory Council, which includes representation from all MSU colleges. A scoring rubric will be utilized to evaluate all grant applications by the FCTL Faculty Advisory Council, who will make the decision regarding funded projects.

Faculty may request up to \$3,000 and budget detail and justification of funds is a required component of the proposal. Recipients of this grant are expected to share the outcomes of their project at FCTL's Showcase on Teaching and Learning or Scholarship Summit and are encouraged to present at other relevant on- and off-campus conferences.
