I am currently in my sixteenth year at MSU as a faculty member in the Department of Theatre and Dance. In that time, I've gained a breadth of experience with Faculty Senate and its committees. I was my departmental representative for my first three years here, then served as Secretary of the Faculty for two years, then later served as Chair-Elect in 2011-12 and Senate Chair from 2012-13. Starting in 2013, I served for three years as Theatre and Dance department head, then returned full time to faculty in 2016 and later rejoined Senate as departmental representative.

I have served on virtually every Senate standing committee, either as a departmental/college representative or as an ex-officio member from the Senate Executive committee. In doing so, I have gained a thorough understanding of how the university works and the ways in which Faculty Senate can best serve the needs of those it represents. I have built productive working relationships with administrators on both the academic and administrative sides of the university.

The primary responsibilities of Senate are twofold. First, we are charged to carry out the faculty side of shared governance, in particular, to oversee curricular changes and ensure quality academic programs.
