

Section 1 – Membership of Faculty Senate

B. Election of Rank Representatives

1. During the first week of the spring semester the Office of the Faculty Senate shall notify academic units of the timeline for upcoming nominations and elections.

B. Each academic unit and the Missouri State University Library, as designated by the Provost Office list of academic units, has the right to have at least one (1) senator. An academic unit with at least 20 Faculty Senate-eligible faculty members, but fewer than 40, has the right to two (2) senators. An academic unit with at least 40, but fewer than 60, Faculty Senate-eligible faculty members, has the right to three (3) senators. An academic

ARTICLE I – FACULTY SENATE

A. The members of the Faculty Senate shall consist of the following senators: the Chair of

C. Good-faith effort must be made by all faculty in an academic unit to support the rotation of faculty senators among the different disciplines within the unit.

D. In odd-numbered years, prior to the beginning of the election cycle, the Office of the Faculty Senate shall evaluate the number of faculty in each academic unit to determine whether any changes in seat allocation are necessary. The Office of the Faculty Senate shall then inform each academic unit and the Faculty Senate of the updated seat count.

Section 2 – Election of Senators

A. Election of Academic Unit Representatives

- 1. During the first week of the spring semester the Office of the Faculty Senate shall notify academic units of the timeline for upcoming nominations and elections and the number of Faculty Senate representatives allotted for each academic unit.
- 2. Faculty in each academic unit shall elect the determined number of representatives for their unit using a method chosen by that academic unit based on parliamentary procedures. If a faculty member so requests, the vote shall be conducted via secret ballot. A simple majority will determine the outcome of the vote.

2. **Nomination of Rank Representatives.** No later than March 1 the members of each faculty rank within each academic unit, when appropriate, shall nominate one (1) person from within that academic department unit to represent that rank in the subsequent annual election for position of rank representative of the Faculty Senate. Ranked faculty in each academic unit shall elect a representative of their respective rank using a method chosen by the unit based on parliamentary procedures. If a faculty member so requests, the vote shall be conducted via secret ballot. A simple majority will determine the outcome of the vote.

A person currently serving as either rank representative or academic unit representative of the Faculty Senate, and whose term will not expire with the current election, shall not be eligible for nomination as a rank representative, nor shall the Chair-Elect of the Faculty Senate, nor nominees for Chair-Elect and Secretary of the Faculty Senate. Each Academic Unit leader shall notify the Office of the Faculty Senate of the outcome of the election no later than March 1.

- 3. **Annual Primary Election of Members to Faculty Senate.** After all nominations have been received, but no later than March 22, the Secretary of the Faculty shall conduct the annual primary election of rank representatives. All members of the ranked faculty of each rank may vote on previously nominated members of that rank to fill positions of rank representative on the Faculty Senate. Each voter may vote for one (1) senator if there is a vacancy in the voter's rank representation.
- 4. **Annual General Election of Members to Faculty Senate.** The annual general election shall be conducted no later than April 15th. In the general election the ranked faculty of each rank may vote for one (1) rank representative if there is a vacancy in the voter's rank representation. In this election a ballot shall be prepared for each rank by the Secretary of the Faculty. This ballot shall contain at least two (2) names for the rank representative if there is a vacancy to be filled from that rank, and these shall be the names of those receiving the highest number of votes in the primary election, but in case of tie votes for first or second position, the ballot shall also contain the names of those tied for those positions.

If the person elected as Secretary of the Faculty is serving a term as a senator, a temporary replacement shall be chosen as specified in Bylaws, Article I, Section 2, Part E, after which the original senator shall serve any remaining portion of his/her term.

C. Election of Representatives for Those Holding Non-Tenure Track Positions

- 1. During the first week of the spring semester, the Office of the Faculty Senate shall notify academic units of the timeline for upcoming nominations and elections of non-tenure track positions.
- 2. Nomination of Representatives for Those Holding Non-Tenure Track Positions. No later than March 1 those holding non-tenure track positions in

academic units containing such faculty shall nominate one person each to represent the instructors, senior instructors, and clinical faculty. Instructors and Clinical Faculty in each academic unit shall elect a nominee of their respective rank using a method chosen by the academic unit based on parliamentary procedures. If a faculty member so requests, the vote shall be conducted via secret ballot. A simple majority will determine the outcome of the vote. The head of each academic unit shall notify the Office of the Faculty Senate of the outcome of the election(s) no later than March 1.

- 3. Annual Primary Election of Representatives for Those Holding Non-Tenure Track Positions. No later than March 22, the Office of the Faculty Senate shall conduct the annual primary election for each of the three non-tenure track representatives. All instructors shall vote for one (1) instructor representative, and all senior instructors shall vote for one (1) senior instructor representative, and all clinical faculty shall vote for one (1) clinical faculty representative.
- 4. Annual General Election of Representatives for Those Holding Non-Tenure Track Positions. No later than April 15, the Office of the Faculty Senate shall conduct the annual general election for a representative from among instructor nominees, a representative from among senior instructor nominees, and a representative from among clinical faculty nominees. In this election, a ballot shall be prepared containing at least two (2) names for each position. Those receiving the highest number of votes, respectively, shall be elected as the instructor, the senior instructor, and clinical faculty representative; those receiving the second highest number of votes, respectively, shall be elected as the alternate representatives.

D. Terms of Service on Faculty Senate

- 1. The Chair of the Faculty Senate, the Secretary of the Faculty, newly elected senators, and liaisons shall take office at the first session following the annual elections. The new Chair is responsible for setting the agenda for that session.
- 2. Each elected Senator shall be elected for an initial two-year term.
- 3. Past-chairs may be elected by their academic unit to serve as a Senator beyond the year the Past-chair serves as Chair of Judicial Review.
- 4. Senators should bear in mind that the Senate Chair may, under extraordinary circumstances, call a meeting during a university break. While nine-month faculty are not contractually obligated to attend such meetings, they will be expected to make a good faith effort to attend.
- 5. The Secretary of the Faculty shall serve a one-year term and shall be eligible to serve two consecutive terms if re-elected.

E. Filling Vacancies and Determination of New Seats

- 1. If a temporary vacancy occurs (one semester or less) and/or should any senator be temporarily unavailable to fulfill the responsibilities of senator, that senator shall arrange for a substitute to take her/his place in the Senate during that Senators absence and shall communicate that to the Office of the Faculty Senate and to their respective academic unit leader.
- 2. If a vacancy longer than one semester occurs, the academic unit, rank, or non-tenure track constituency experiencing the vacancy must nominate and elect a new Senate representative per usual parliamentary procedures or unless a member of the faculty requests a secret ballot.
- 3. The Office of the Faculty Senate, in odd years, and in consultation with the Provost Office's list of identified academic unites and number of Faculty Senate-eligible faculty, will determine whether or not academic units are allotted the correct number of senators and will make any necessary subtractions or additions per Article I, Section 1, Part B, of the Bylaws of the Faculty.

Section 3 – Liaisons

- A. Liaisons of the Faculty Senate may attend and speak at Faculty Senate meetings. Liaisons shall consist of the following: one liaison from the Student Government Association, one liaison from the Graduate Student Senate, and one liaison from the Staff Senate.
- B. The Liaisons serve in an *ex-officio* capacity and may be appointed, or elected, by the group they represent. Liaisons shall serve one-year terms but may serve consecutive terms if the groups they represent so decide.
