Annual Highlights

- 40th Showcase on Teaching and Learning
 - Morning Workshop & Keynote Lunch: Dr. Sid Dobrin (University of Florida) led a 90-minute workshop on Integrating AI into Instruction for a packed audience (>100). He presented a keynote session at lunch on Navigating Technology, Knowledge, and Human Interaction. There was an estimated 240 in attendance.
 - Faculty Sessions: There were 14 sessions led by 24 faculty representing 5 colleges and professional staff from 8 different academic support units.
 - Drop-in Brightspace Help: FCTL instructional designers offered Brightspace assistance throughout the morning.

Spring Scholarship Summit

The FCTL hosted their first summit providing an interdisciplinary venue for faculty to showcase their research.

- o There were 13 poster sessions and 22 faculty presenters.
- o There were 89 faculty and guests in attendance.

Faculty Learning Communities (FLCs)

Faculty may submit an idea for leading a FLC. Faculty are paid \$1,500 for leading a year-long FLC or \$750 for a semester long group. The majority of FLC topics have centered around Al in teaching.
