- 1. The Board of Governors has finalized the membership of the presidential search committee, including the appointment of three faculty members: Eric Bosch (CNAS), Melissa Burnett (COBA), and Pauline Nugent (Faculty Senate). The Chair added that while Dr. Nugent is a COAL faculty member and was listed in the press release as such, she was appointed to the search committee as a member of the Faculty Senate Executive Committee. In addition to the two elected faculty nominees from each college, the Board also considered the elected members of the Faculty Senate Executive Committee as nominees for the search committee.
- 2. All faculty should have received an email from The IDEA Center requesting participation in a survey providing feedback on our Deans and Department Heads. Every January the Provost's Office, as part of an agreement with Faculty Senate and Faculty Concerns Committee, solicits systematic feedback about our Deans and Department Heads. REPORT FROM ACADEMIC RELATIONS COMMITTEE

David Lutz, Chair of the Academic Relations Committee, presented the committee's report. Senator Cornelius-White moved a Senate Action to revise the IGrade Student Evaluation form by adding two items: "The courses expectations were clearly defined" and "I would take this professor again if possible." Seconded by Senator Hughes.

Senator Cornelius-White moved that the first item be amended to add an apostrophe to the word "courses" and the second item be revised to read "I would take another course from this professor if possible." The revisions passed by unanimous consent.

The Senate Action to revise IGrade passed as amended.

Senate Action 18-09/10

Senator Jones moved a resolution that the Senate and the Provost's office investigate a mechanism for providing an "additional online summary of instructor performance" separate from the IGrade Student Evaluation Form. Seconded by Senator Cornelius-White.

Dr. Norander (substituting for Senator Morris) moved to amend the last bulleted point in the first resolved paragraph to read "the learning environment created within the course." Seconded by Senator Cornelius-White. The motion to amend passed.

Senator Hurst moved to amend the resolution by rewording the last paragraph to read "Be it further resolved, that the Faculty Senate and Office of the Provost further investigate unifying the various student evaluations to avoid redundancy that could result in students devaluing such evaluations." Seconded by Senator Gallaway. The motion to amend passed by unanimous consent.

Senator Cornelius-White moved to amend the first resolved paragraph by replacing the words "instructor performance" with "information." The motion to amend passed by unanimous consent.

Senator Rovey moved to commit the issues presented by the Academic Relations Committee's resolution to an Ad Hoc Committee (seconded by Senator Hughes).

After discussion, the motion to commit passed. Chair Weaver asked faculty interested in serving on the committee to contact her or the Secretary of the Faculty.

REPORT FROM AD HOC COMMITTEE ON THE CURRICULAR PROCESS

Secretary Herr, Chair of the Committee, presented the report and moved the committee's resolution to forward its recommendations to the Rules Committee for consideration and action and to implement a curricular calendar by the beginning of the next academic year. Seconded by Senator Gallaway. The resolution passed.

Senator Hughes moved to amend the language of the final paragraph to read "Be it further resolved that, colleges and/or departments develop enrollment minimum plans and submit them to the central administration." Seconded by Senator Chesman.

Senator Berry moved to amend Senator Hughes' amendment to read "Be it further resolved that, colleges and/or departments have the opportunity to develop enrollment minimum plans and submit them to the Provost's office." The motion to amend the amendment passed by unanimous consent.

Senator Hughes' motion to amend the last paragraph passed.

Senator Rovey moved to amend the fourth paragraph to read "Whereas, students and faculty are negatively affected when class schedules are changed shortly before the beginning of a semester." Seconded by Senator Gibson. The motion to amend passed.

WHEREAS, Missouri State University currently provides the five-item IGrade Evaluation results for all faculty on the website; and

WHEREAS, the Student Government Association has proposed additional IGrade items to enhance the evaluation; and

WHEREAS, those items have been supported by the Academic Relations Committee;

BE IT RESOLVED, that the following two items be added to Missouri State University's IGrade Student Evaluation Form:

- The course's expectations were clearly defined.
- I would take another class from this professor if possible.

Resolution on Recommended Changes to the Curricular Process

Be it resolved, that Recommendations 1, 2, and 3 be forwarded to the Rules Committee for consideration and action.

Be if further resolved, that the Senate Executive Committee, in conjunction with other concerned committees, implement Recommendation 4 in time for the next academic year.

Senate Action Regarding Enrollment Minimums

WHEREAS, the administration has established campus-wide enrollment minimums;

WHEREAS, individual departments are acutely aware of student needs, enrollment trends, and available departmental resources;

WHEREAS, President Nietzel has shifted budgetary responsibility to individual colleges;

WHEREAS, students and faculty are negatively affected when class schedules are changed shortly before the beginning of a semester;

BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Faculty Senate recommends that current enrollment minimums established by central administration be eliminated;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT, colleges and/or departments have the opportunity to develop enrollment minimum plans and submit them to the Provost's office.
