Scholarships for Freshmen

MSU institutionally funded scholarships

These scholarships are funded by MSU. See below for scholarship criteria, application information and deadlines.

MSU donor funded scholarships

These scholarships are gifts to the University made by individuals, groups or organizations and awarded to Missouri State students each year. Access MSU annual scholarship information.

Op5.08-10 Scholarships for Entering Freshmen

This policy applies to students admitted beginning summer 2019. Students admitted for previous semesters should visit the <u>How Do I Keep My Financial Aid</u> page.

The university offers a range of institutionally-funded scholarships to entering first-time students. To qualify for these scholarships, you must meet the specific criteria and also:

- Graduate from a high school accredited by a state education agency or a regional accrediting
 association recognized by the United States Department of Education. Homeschooled students
 should refer to <u>Information for Homeschooled Students</u>.
- Be admitted and enroll full-time at the Springfield campus the year you graduate from high school. If you will graduate from high school early, you may be considered for scholarships on an individual basis. All deadlines and requirements will apply.
- Meet <u>freshman admission requirements</u> as of the scholarship application deadline.
- Be <u>lawfully present</u> in the United States.

Grade point average (GPA) requirements are based on a 4.00 scale rounded to the nearest 0.01. If your school does not use a 4.00 scale, your GPA will be converted (see details). If your school provides a weighted GPA, it will be used to determine scholarship eligibility. Sixth or seventh semester GPAs will be considered unless otherwise noted.

ACT or SAT scores must be taken by the test dates indicated. Your highest score will be used. SAT scores are based on the sum of the Evidence-Based Reading/Writing and Math portions.


University scholarships can be combined only as shown under the **Combining Scholarships** heading.

The University reserves the right to limit scholarship offers based on availability of funds.

Automatic scholarships

Scholarships shown below are automatically awarded to qualified students who apply for admission by January 15 of their senior year. A separate scholarship application is not required. Students who apply after January 15 may be considered on an individual basis if funding is available. Students who are selected will be notified by mail.

Your initial scholarship eligibility will be based on your high school GPA and ACT or SAT scores upon admission. If you subsequently improve your GPA (sixth or seventh semester) or test score (earned through a February test date), your scholarship will be upgraded.



- SAT score reflects the sum of the evidence-based reading/writing and mathematics portions of the SAT.
- Cumulative GPA is determined after the sixth or seventh high school semester.
- Renewal criteria for all above scholarships: Complete 27 MSU credit hours per year with a cumulative MSU GPA of 3.25 or higher.
- Out-of-State Tuition Waiver included for all above scholarships For non-Missouri students.
 Approximately \$7,950 per year.

Additional information for automatic scholarships

Board of Governors Scholarship

International Baccalaureate Diploma recipients will be awarded the Board of Governors Scholarship regardless of test scores.

Board of Governors Scholarship recipients qualify for admission to the Honors College, have access to a \$1,000 study away voucher, and must average 40 hours per year of campus or community service during their first three years to renew for their fourth year.

Provost Scholarship

Students who are (a) *ranked first or second* in their class or (b) in the top 10 percent of their class and have an ACT of 26 or higher (SAT 1230) by February will receive the Provost Scholarship. Only sixth or seventh semester class ranks will be considered.

Competitive scholarships

Presidential Scholarship

The Presidential Scholarship is the University's top academic scholarship.

Value

\$12,500 per year (\$6,250 for tuition and \$6,250 for on-campus housing). Total potential value over four years: \$50,000. Non-Missouri residents also receive a full waiver of out-of-state tuition.

Selection criteria

ACT composite score of 31 (SAT of 1390) or higher from a test taken on or before October of your senior year and a cumulative sixth semester GPA of 3.90 or higher. National Merit Semifinalists may also apply. Finalists are selected through an on-campus interview

Number offered

35

Another 50 students who interview for the Presidential Scholarship will be offered the **University Scholarship**, equal to the Board of Governors Scholarship plus an additional \$2,000 per year for the first two years that can be applied to on-campus housing.

Application

Complete the Presidential Scholarship Application and apply for admission by December 1 of your senior year.

Renewal criteria

Presidential Scholars must complete 27 MSU credit hours per year with a cumulative MSU GPA of 3.50 or higher. To renew for their fourth year, Presidential Scholars must also complete an average of 40 hours of community or campus service each year during their first three years. Renewal criteria for the **University Scholarship** are the same as for the Board of Governors Scholarship.

Inclusive Excellence Scholarship

The Inclusive Excellence Scholarship supports the University's commitment to diversity and inclusive excellence. Students selected for this program will participate in a personal and leadership development program administered by the Office of Multicultural Services.

Value

\$4,000 per year. Total potential value over four years: \$16,000. Non-Missouri residents will also receive a full waiver of out-of-state tuition.

Application

Submit the Inclusive Excellence Scholarship

Application by January 30. You must also have submitted an application for admission, required transcripts and test scores, and the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) by that date

Selection criteria

To be considered for this scholarship, you must have a demonstrated commitment to the promotion of diversity and inclusion. You must also meet one or more of the following criteria:

- Be from a historically underrepresented group (including, but not limited to Black/African American, Asian/Asian American/Pacific Islander/Desi American, Hispanic/Latinx, Indigenous (Native American, Alaskan, Hawaiian), Multiethnic, LGBTQ+)
- Be from a low socio-economic background
- Be a first-generation student (you are considered first-generation if neither of your parents has a bachelor's degree)

Have a documented disability

Your academic performance and your record of school and community service will also be considered.

Students will be selected by a committee established by the Office of Multicultural Services.

Renewal criteria

Complete 27 MSU credit hours per year with a cumulative MSU GPA of 2.75 or higher and complete the requirements of the Inclusive Excellence Program established by the Office of Multicultural Services.

Hutchens/SGA Centennial Leaders Scholarship

The Hutchens/SGA Centennial Leadership Scholarship is designed to recognize and encourage leadership. Students chosen for this scholarship will participate in a <u>leadership development program</u>.

Value

\$2,500 per year (\$1,000 for students who are also receiving either the Provost or Deans Scholarship).

Total potential value over four years: \$10,000 (\$4,000 for recipients of Provost or Deans).

Application

Selection criteria

To be considered, you must demonstrate that you have excelled in three of the following four areas: leadership, performing arts, volunteerism, and athletics. You must also be in the upper half of your class (or have a GPA of 3.00 or higher) after your sixth semester and have an ACT of 20 or higher (or an SAT score of 1030 or higher). Qualifying scores must be earned on tests taken during or before December of your senior year.

candidates from among the qualified applicants who will be invited to an on-campus interview program. Finalists will be selected as a result of the interview process.

Renewal criteria

Complete at least 27 MSU credit hours per year with a cumulative MSU GPA of 2.75 or higher and successfully fulfill the requirements of the leadership development program.

MSU donor-funded scholarships

Through private gifts to the Missouri State University Foundation by individuals, groups, or companies, scholarships are awarded annually to students who demonstrate outstanding academic achievement, leadership and/or financial need. Most donor-funded scholarships are awarded to students who have completed one or more years at Missouri State. A limited number are available to entering students. Most have specific criteria (e.g., specific majors or graduation from a specific high school), and their average value is approximately \$1,000. To be considered for these scholarships, you must be admitted to the University and complete the online MSU Annual Scholarship Application by March 1.
