1. Welcome Jeff Coiner

2. My Missouri State Upgrade Theresa McCoy

We are in production, and are still planning to turn off the old system at the end of May 2023. The feedback form traffic has slowed down, and most individuals are adapting well. We are working on cards that are missing, such as the "Library Card". We are adding key words to make the search process better. We ran into an unexpected issue with people who do not have accounts anymore; we are working on this. We are almost ready to consider this project concluded. Dr. Herr let the group know that it is fairly easy to manipulate.

3. Oracle Cloud Infrastructure / Banner Move Jeff Coiner

The Office of Information Services is in the process of moving Banner Systems into the Oracle Cloud. We are making progress and building the production environment this week. The migration is ongoing, and the plan is to cut over to the cloud at the end of May. We are doing everything possible to minimize the impact on the MSU faculty, students, and staff. We expect it to be as seamless as possible.

4. SCUF Volume computer purchase update Kevin Piercy

SCUF ordered seven hundred new All-In-One Computers for the Lab's replacement cycle. We upgraded the older systems/software and redistributed other items that we could use on campus. No more Lenovos: we got our thirteen years out of them. We will still see some of these around campus. One of our biggest expenses and now we have end of life for Windows 10 coming up.

5. Windows 10 EOL

With the 700 machines purchased this year we will continue our migration to Windows 11. In October 2025, Microsoft will no longer support Windows 10. The colleges and administrative offices have been working to ensure the departments on campus are up to date. Currently, on campus the classrooms are in good shape moving toward Windows 11, but we have more to be replaced by October 2025.

6. SGA update on projects

Becca met with Dr. Dee Sisco on the laptop project for the Meyer Library and Dr. Sisco approved. We are waiting for approval from the Student Senate; and hopefully we will have by the end of summer 2023. Grammarly, is another project SGA has been working on, and we are looking forward to doing another pilot program. There is a cost associated with this option. Spoke with Dr. Sisco about the \$10,000 cost and how SGA could provide 4,000 of that cost. There aren't enough funds for this fiscal year but possibly in the next year, starting July 1, 2023. Ultimately, the next SGA representative will continue to work to push for Grammarly on campus.

7. Learning Management System (LMS) onsite visits

We had onsite meetings with three LMS vendors. Blackboard provided the least favorable solution, Canvas was good and D2L was the one that stood out. Therefore, we have been talking with D2L and references. We had a great deal of faculty, staff and students participate with the discussion and had great questions. We plan to be ready for the Board meeting in May 2023 to make a recommendation to move forward.
