





Statewide Community of PHN Practice with Regional Learning Communities



Community of Practice (CoP)



A group of people who share a concern, a set of problems, or a passion about a topic, and who deepen their knowledge and expertise by interacting on an ongoing basis.

Benefits of a CoP

Members

- Continual learning/ professional development
- Access to expertise
- Improved communication with peers
- Increased productivity and quality of work
- Networking for keeping current in field
- Sense of professional identity
- Enhanced professional reputation



Community Sponsor



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


