- Part educator

What They Actually Do

- Teach people how to stay healthy
- Give vaccines to protect the community
- ▶ e Track outbreaks (like COVID or flu)
- Visit new moms and babies at home
- Promote healthy eating & active living
- Connect people with resources
- Advocate for equity and access
- Think "healthcare + social justice = PHN"

- 9:00 AM Home visit with a new mom
- ▶ 11:00 AM Immunization clinic
- ▶ 1:00 PM Talk at a high school
- ▶ 3:00 PM Follow-up on a TB contact
- 5:00 PM Return messages from clients
- No two days are the same... and that's the fun of it!

Why It Matters


- "Public Health Nurses help prevent illness before it starts."
