Each Fraternity and Sorority is allowed six (6) eligible students per academic year to break their on-campus housing contracts at semester and move into their registered chapter house. If the organization has a GPA below 2.5 or if any of the students living in the chapter house are in violation of a residence life agreement, that chapter house will not be permitted to accept any new students from on-campus housing.

In order for a student to be eligible to break the contract, they must meet <u>ALL</u> of the following criteria:

- 1. Must have lived on campus for two full semesters, not including summer, OR have stared the semester with at least 30 post-high school credit hours (duel credit does not count). First time-new in college members are not eligible.
- 2. Must have SUCCESSFULLY completed 24 credit hours by the end of the fall semester
- 3. Must have a cumulative GPA of 2.5 (if Chapter House GPA is between 2.5 and 2.74) **OR** Must have a cumulative GPA of 2.0 (if Chapter House GPA is 2.75 or higher).
- 4. Chapter advisor must send a list (e-mail is sufficient) of all students wishing to move into the chapter house who are in good standing with the fraternity or sorority to MatthewMcGhee@missouristate.edu. The student's name must be on that list.


In order to seek a Fraternity/Sorority breakage, any on-campus student wishing to move into their chapter house must complete the "Not Returning Form" found on our website.
