Important notes about this major:

Transition points: All students pursuing Missouri certification are required to meet a series of Transition Points that will be assessed, evaluated, and monitored throughout the teacher education program with assistance and guidance from faculty. There are five distinct Transition Points students meet from entry to their education program to follow up post graduate training. In addition, students must meet teacher certification, teacher education, and secondary education requirements that are outlined here: <https://www.missouristate.edu/registrar/catalog/teacher-certification-teacher-education-secondary-ed.htm>

- Juniors who have earned a 3.0 cumulative GPA are eligible to apply to the Accelerated English BSEd-MSEd degree program. After you're admitted to the program, you may take up to 12 credit hours of mixed credit courses, which fulfill both undergraduate BSEd and graduate MSEd program requirements. Mixed credit (accelerated MSEd courses) effectively enables you to double-count courses toward the BSEd and MSEd programs.
- ENG 576, ENG 590, ENG 520 and ENG 521 and ENG 400 or 500-level listed below have accelerated English MSEd course equivalents. You're encouraged to speak with an advisor about the application and registration process prior to your fifth semester.
- Students are strongly encouraged to take and pass the PRAXIS exam (#020) prior to their seventh semester. Apply for student teaching. Applications for spring student teaching are due August 1. (Applications for fall student teaching are due February 1.)

Teacher education program requirements:

- At least a 2.75 GPA on all course work attempted at all colleges attended
- At least a 3.00 GPA in professional education courses
- At least a 3.00 GPA in any additional certificate subject area

- OTC students are strongly encouraged to meet with their major specific MSU transfer advisor early in their OTC education to discuss the most appropriate OTC coursework for their intended MSU major, MSU degree requirements, etc.
- Students are required to fulfill MSU graduation and GPA requirements to receive a degree and should consult with their MSU advisor and the MSU undergraduate catalog for details, as there may exist pre-requisite requirements as well as periodicity limitations that could affect scheduling sequences.
- Please note that transfer students from Missouri public colleges and universities may follow the general education and general baccalaureate degree requirements in effect at Missouri State when they first enrolled (or re-enrolled after an absence of one calendar year or more) as degree-seeking students at the institutions from which they transferred (e.g., OTC).
