Admission to this program is separate from admission to the University. It requires completion of coursework in two or three MSU departments in place of one major or a major with a minor. It is appropriate for those, who through several years of interdisciplinary and focused study, have learned that their interests are not well served within a single academic major. It is not available to students who currently have fewer than 75 completed hours.
