I also have assisted on architectural history surveys, and I've conducted historical research on General Land Office, deed, cemetery, marriage, and tax records, among others. I am a common peer reviewer of articles submitted for publication in journals and I am currently editor of *The Missouri Archaeologist* and the *Missouri Archaeological Society Quarterly*, which entails soliciting and editing manuscripts, preparation of forewords and columns, and many other activities.
